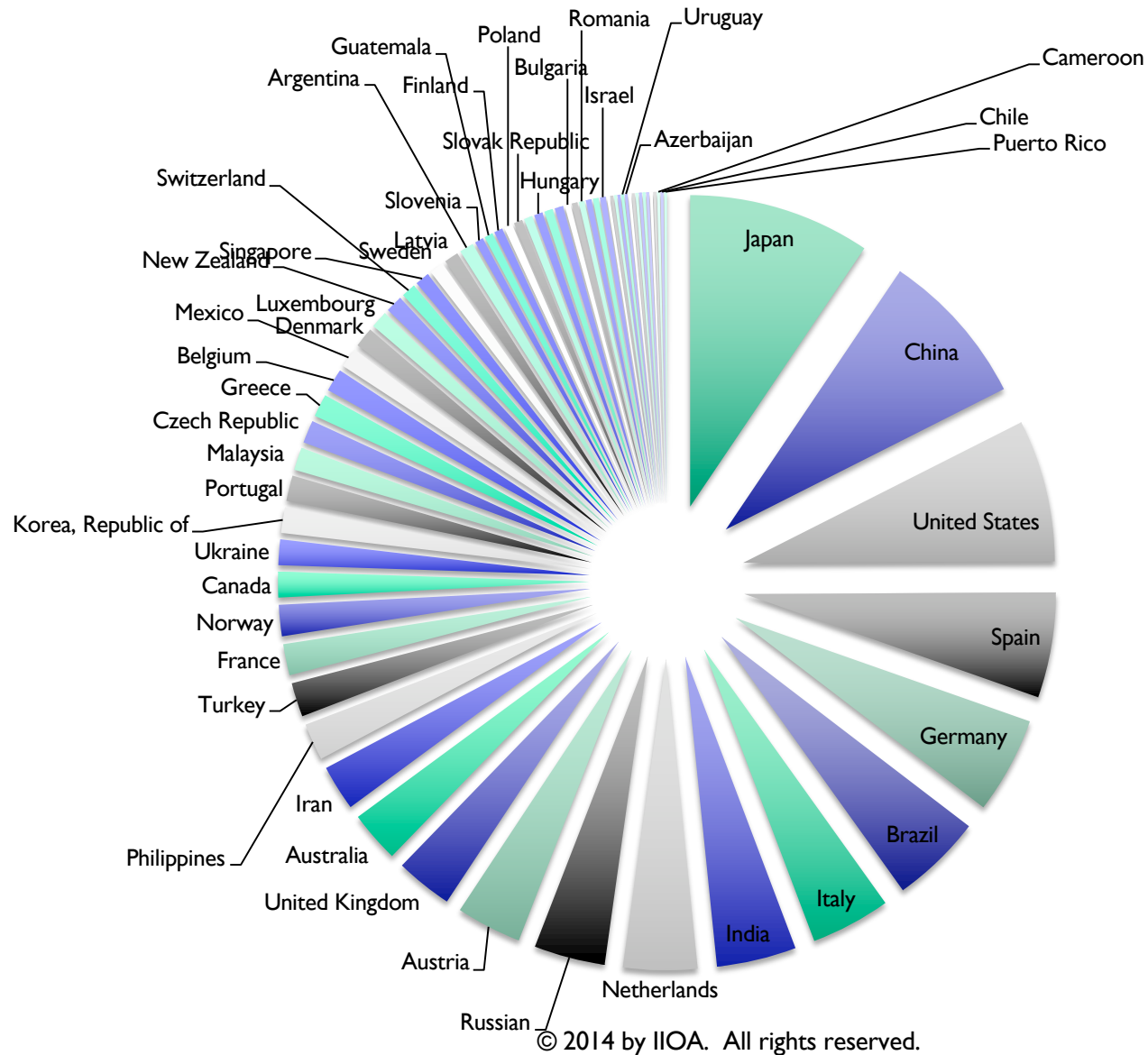

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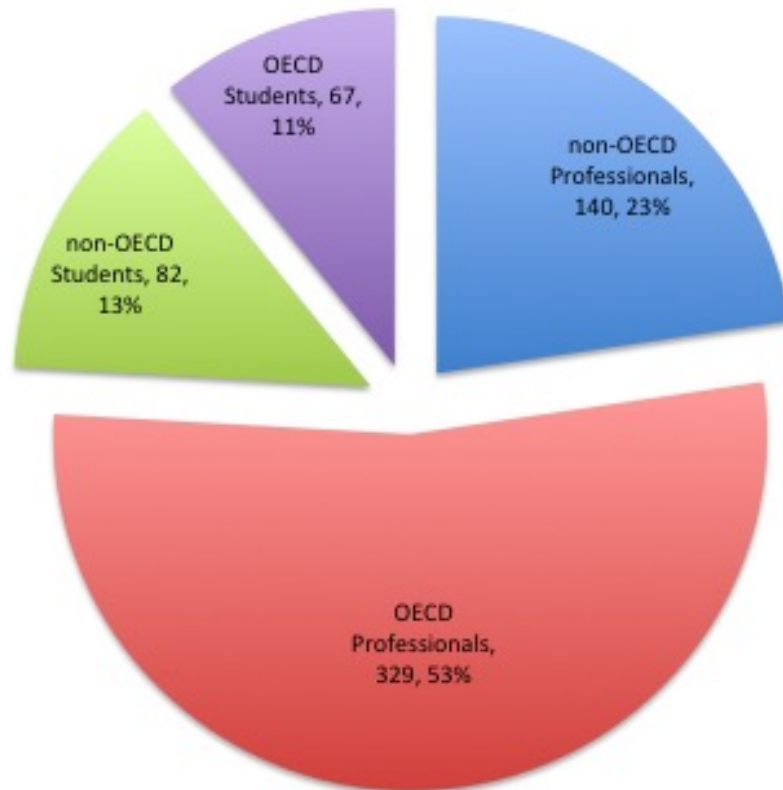

# IIOA Membership as of 25 May 2014: 652 Persons, 67 Countries

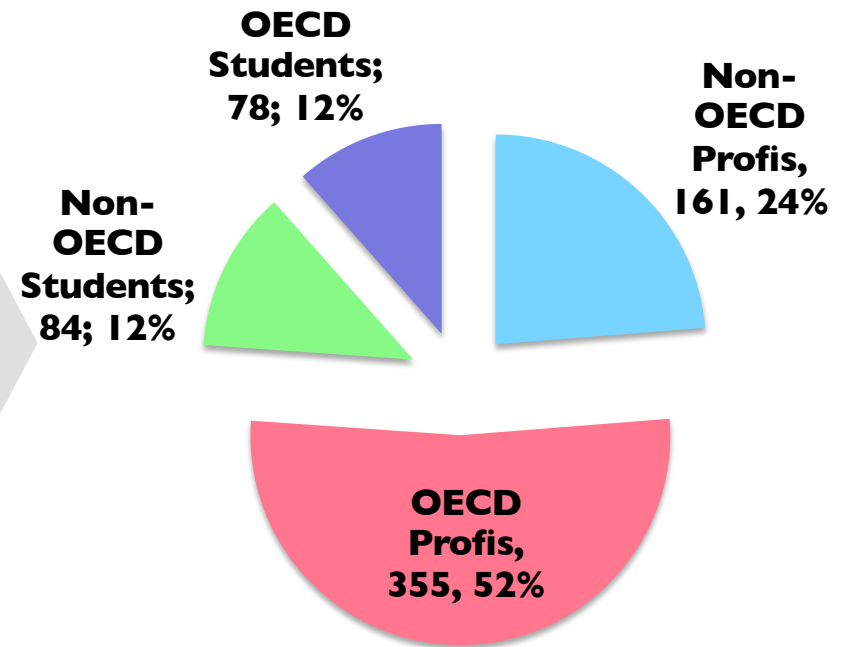


# IIOA Membership by Type

1<sup>st</sup> July 2013



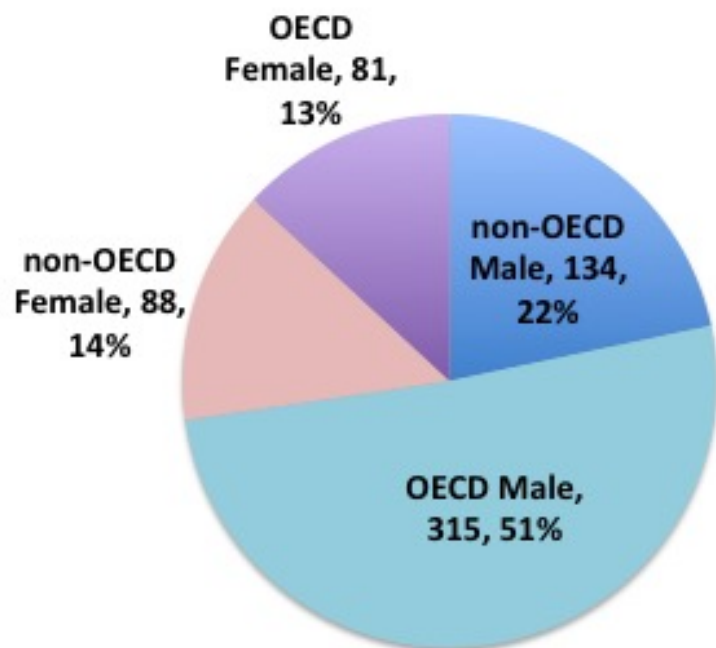

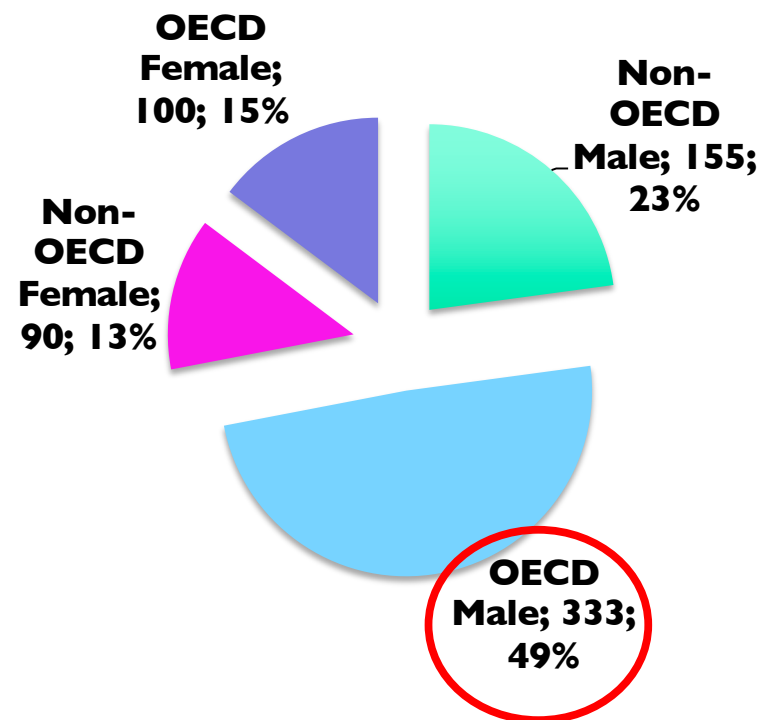
# IIOA Membership by Gender

# IIOA Financials 2013



- For 2013, IIOA shows a **surplus** instead of the expected deficit.
- Reason: Highest ever Non-Members Surcharge **Kitakyushu Conference**.
- **Royalties** dropped slightly to ca. US\$ 37,000
- **Institutional Membership** contributions declined, after 2 years of a hike.
- **Private Membership** contributions jumped.
- **Legal advisory** costs (Statutes, software IP questions) due to Council requests for clarification.
- **Website upgrade**: Systems integration with WEBADMIN, COPASS
- **14 Travel Grants**: lower cost than projected.

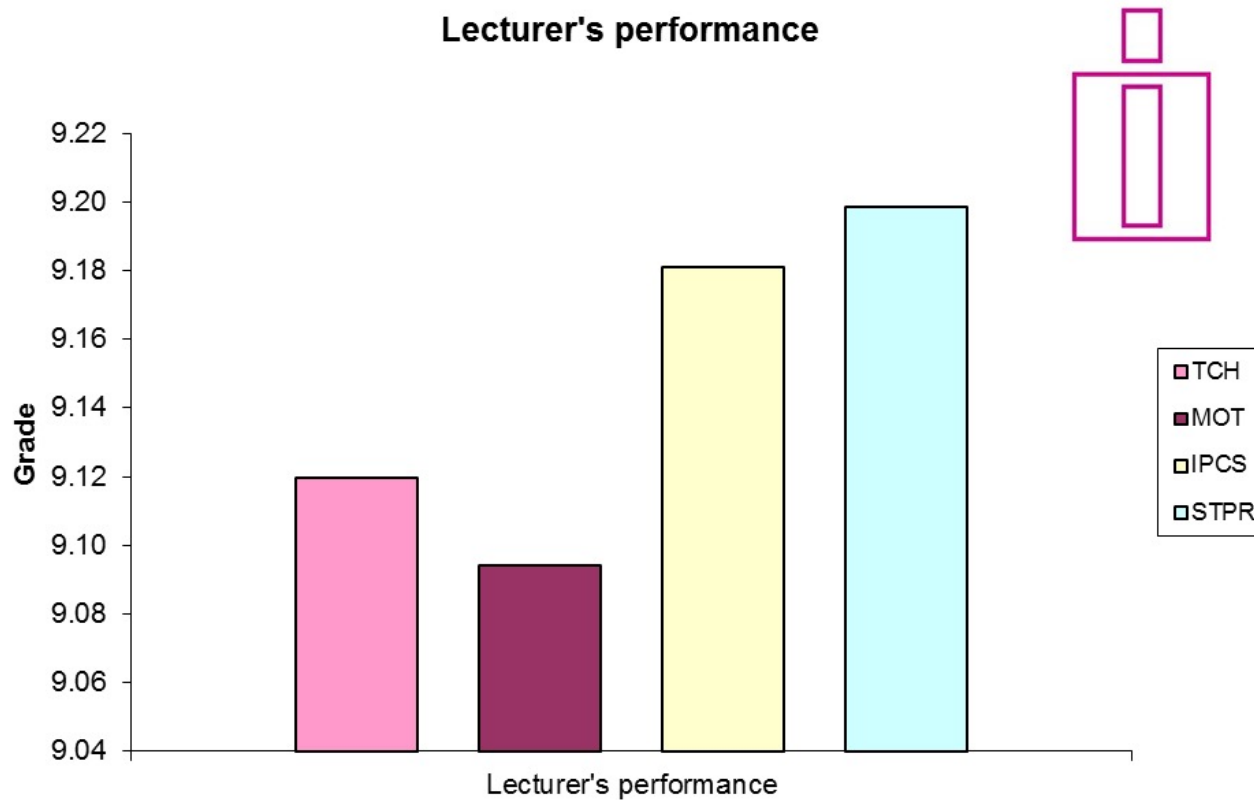

**Table 1.- Attendance and overall grade of the course**

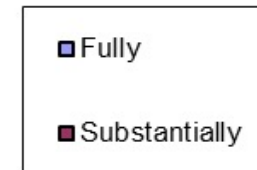
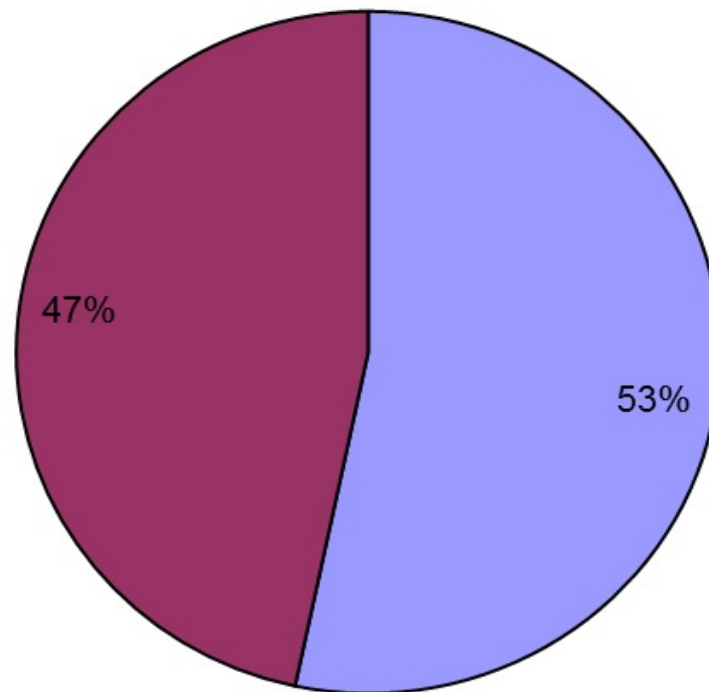

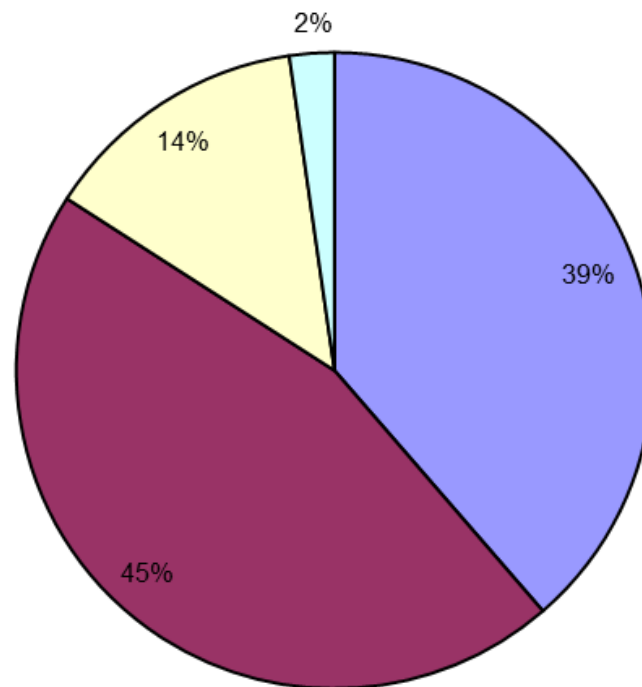

## Summary of IOSG activities over 2013/2014

- Long-term Strategy Committee
  - Little progress until 2014 Lisbon Conference – now in a good position.
- UN Handbook – very good progress.
- Arranged seven parallel sessions at the 2014 Lisbon Conference.
- Facilitated key note speaker session – Walter Radermacher and Geoffrey Hewings.
- Successful Panel Session on “European Statistics on Competitiveness in a Globally Competitive World – What is the role of Input-Output statistics?”
  - High-level speakers including Director Generals of Eurostat, Trade and ECFIN plus OECD.

# UN Handbook



- Background
  - Need to update present version Handbook on Input-Output Compilation and Analysis (1999).
  - Process initially started in 2010 but postponed.
  - Formally started by UNSD in January 2013.
  - Editorial Board in place (April 2013)
    - 12 Members plus UNSD
    - Mix of members from different continents, academia, NSIs, etc.
    - **Nine members of IIOA. including some IIOA Council Members.**
    - Chief Editor – Sanjiv Mahajan
  - Way of working
    - Team effort – authors of each chapter.
    - Sanjiv Mahajan and Joerg Beutel produce standardised tables, etc.
    - Teleconferences and emails.
    - Meeting in New York.

# UN Handbook



- Summary of aims
  - Consistency with SNA 2008, BPM 6, SEEA and ISIC Revision 4.
  - Focus on the evolution of SUTs.
  - Recommend best practice and acceptable alternatives.
  - Integration theme – SUTs, IOTs, physical and monetary tables.
  - Focus on use of General Statistical Business Process Model.
- Way forward
  - Further discussions, drafting, re-structuring and editing.
  - Global consultation – around November 2014.
  - Incorporation of feedback.
  - Submission to UN Statistical Commission Feb/Mar 2015.
  - Publication mid-2015.

    - be proactive in developing better **links with other organisations**.
    - need to improve **user awareness and user knowledge** of IIOA and its work.
    - identify evolving topics/issues to develop and **contribute to the debate and needs of society of the day**.
  - Various supporting initiatives agreed.
- Way forward
  - Agreed summary of the objectives will be placed on the IIOA Web-site.
  - Comments will be welcomed from IIOA Members.
  - Progress will be reviewed at future Council Meetings.

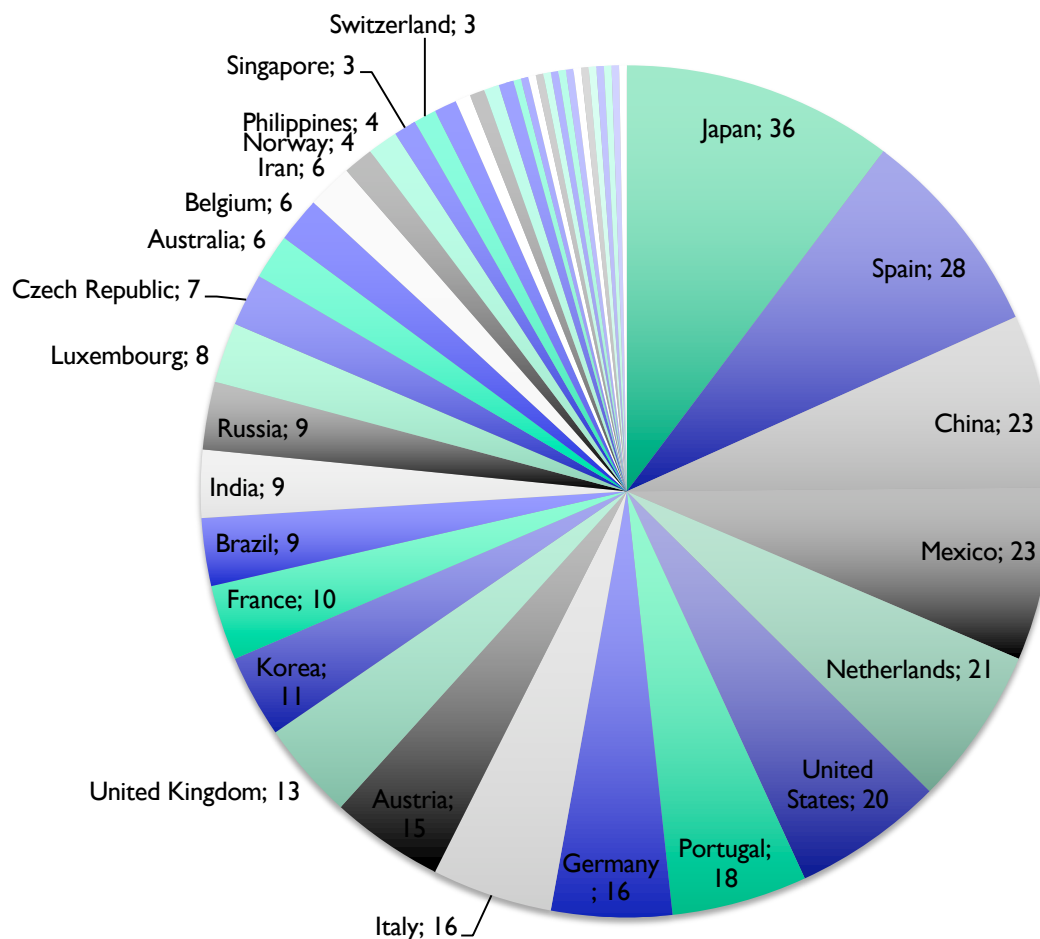

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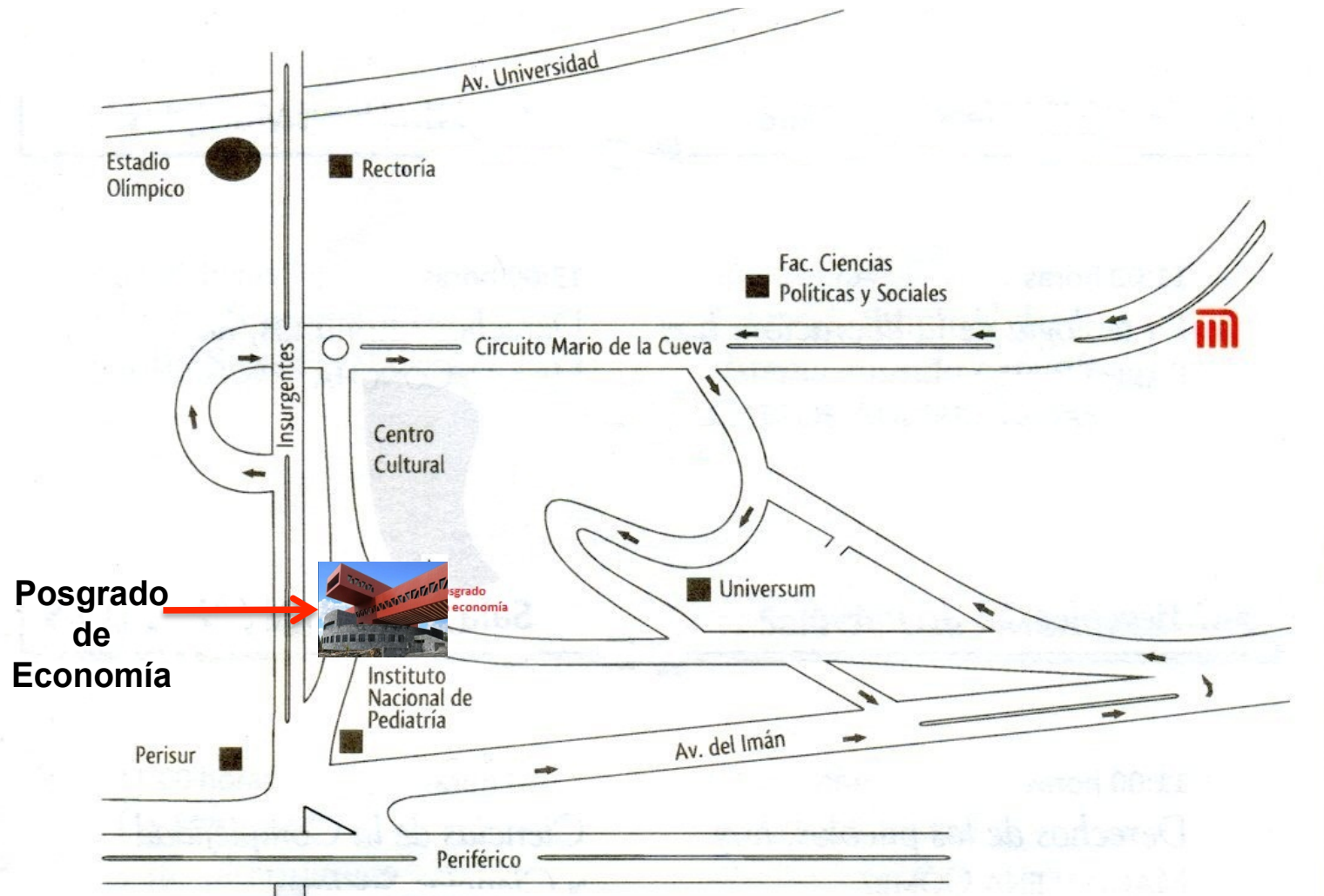
