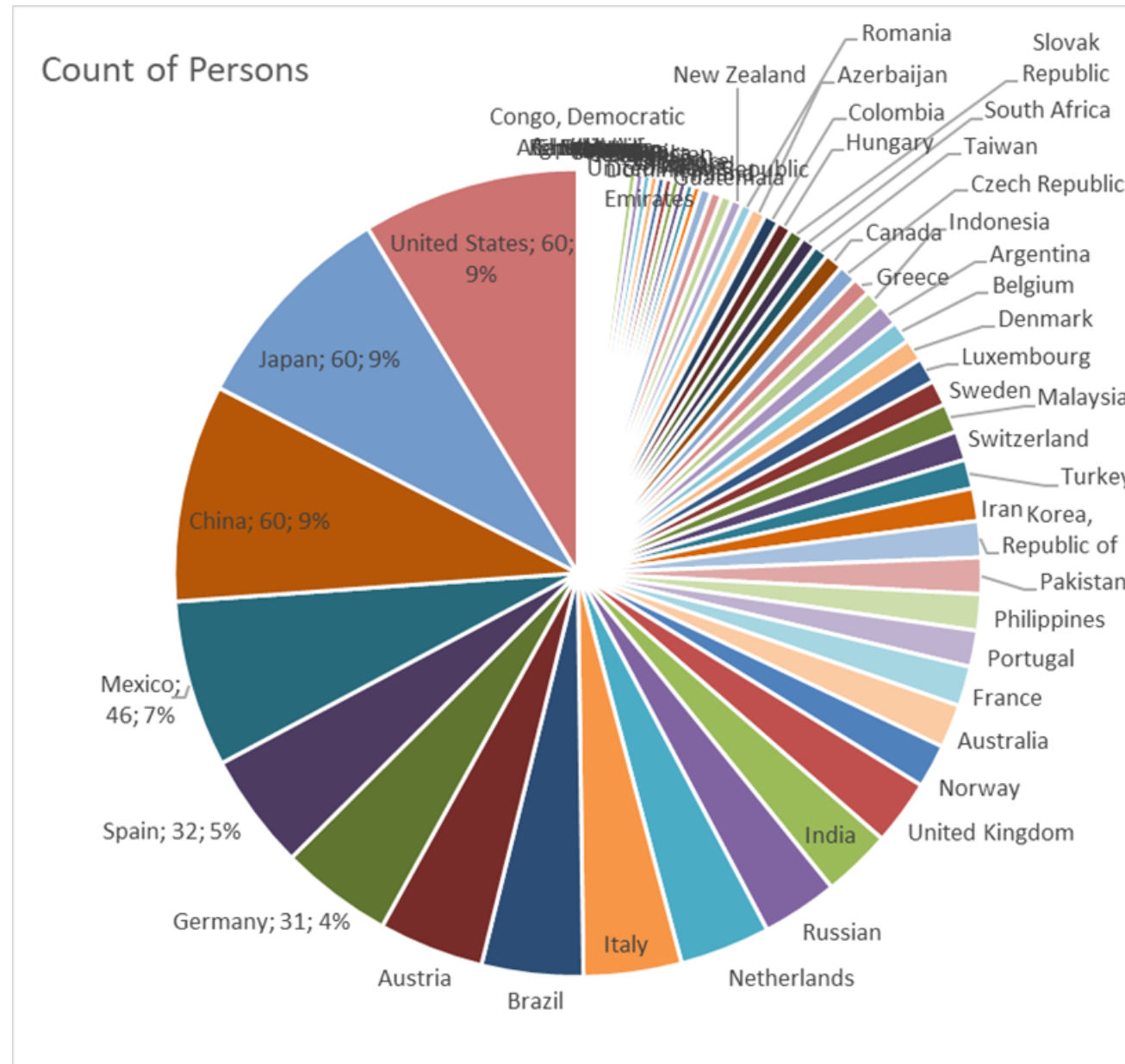

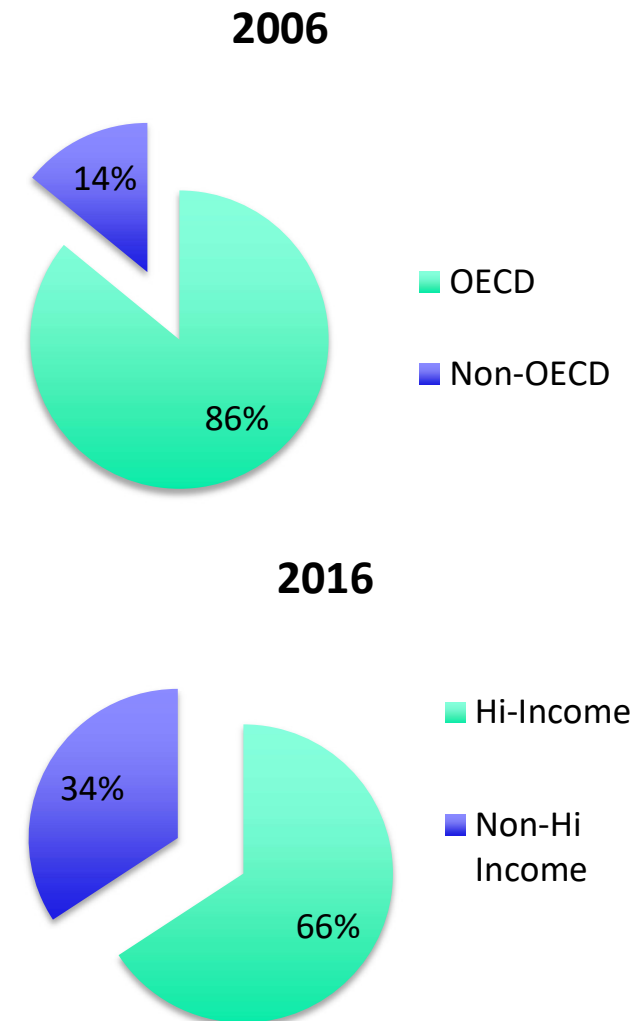
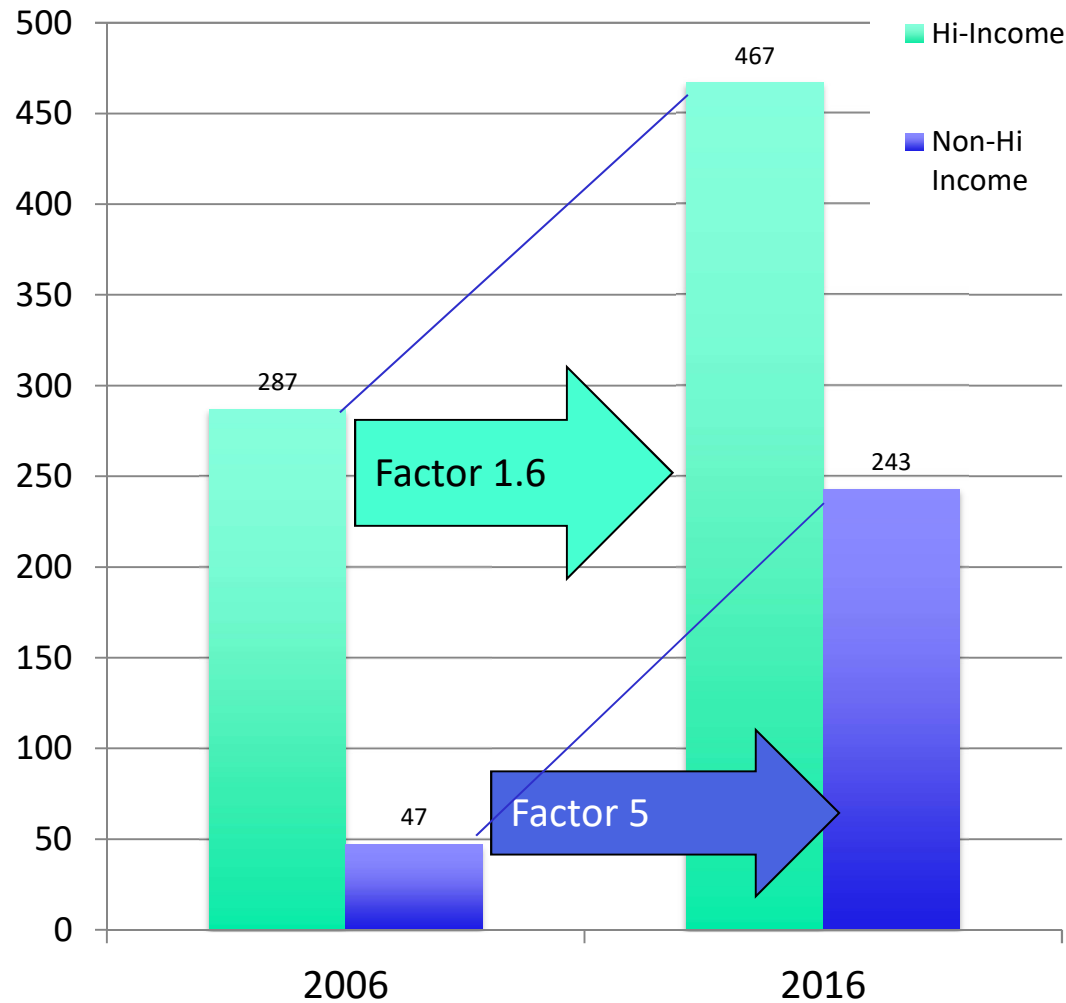
Comparison 2010 vs. 2016:



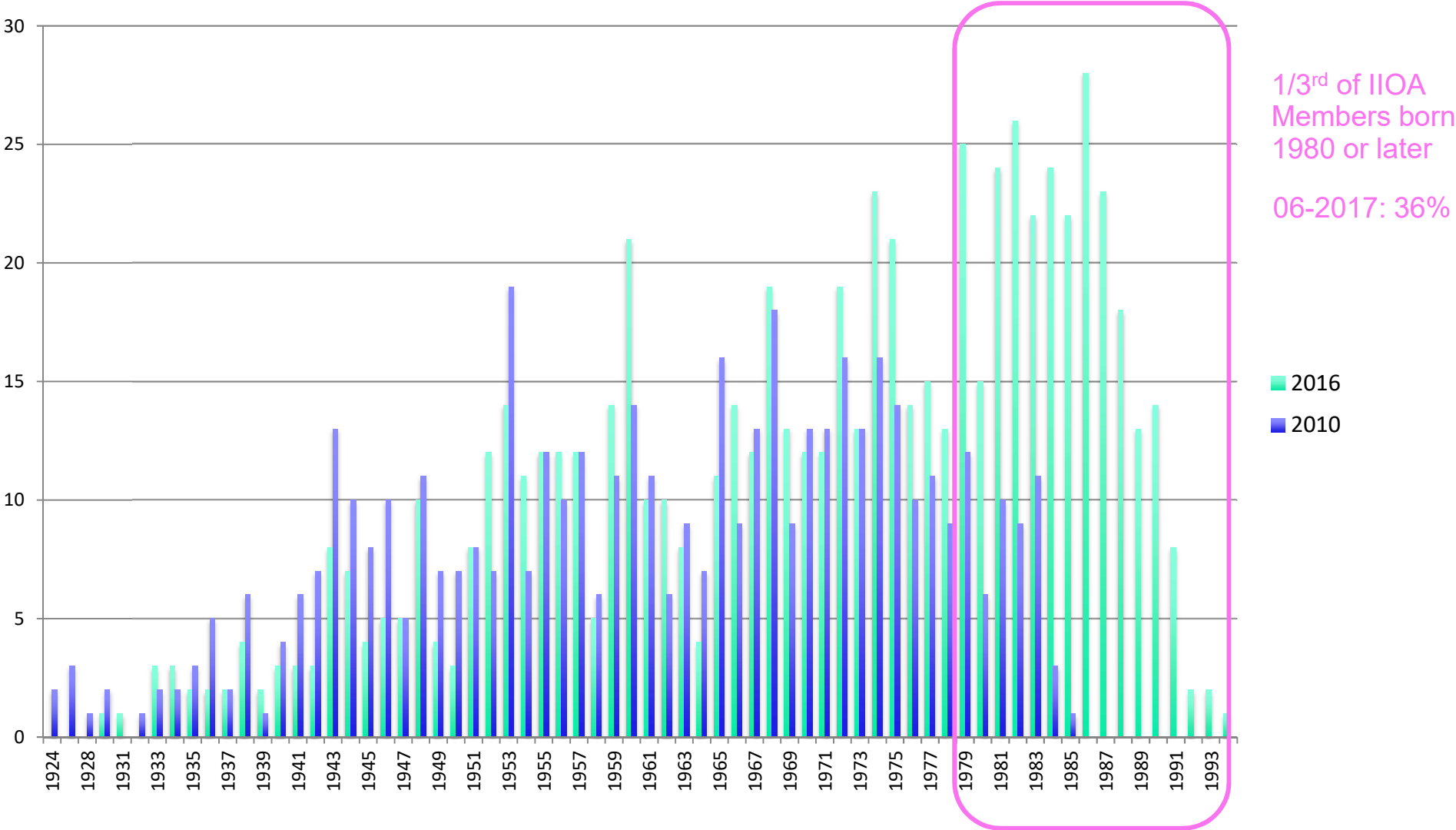
IIOA Membership as of 15 June 2016: 689 Persons, 68 Countries



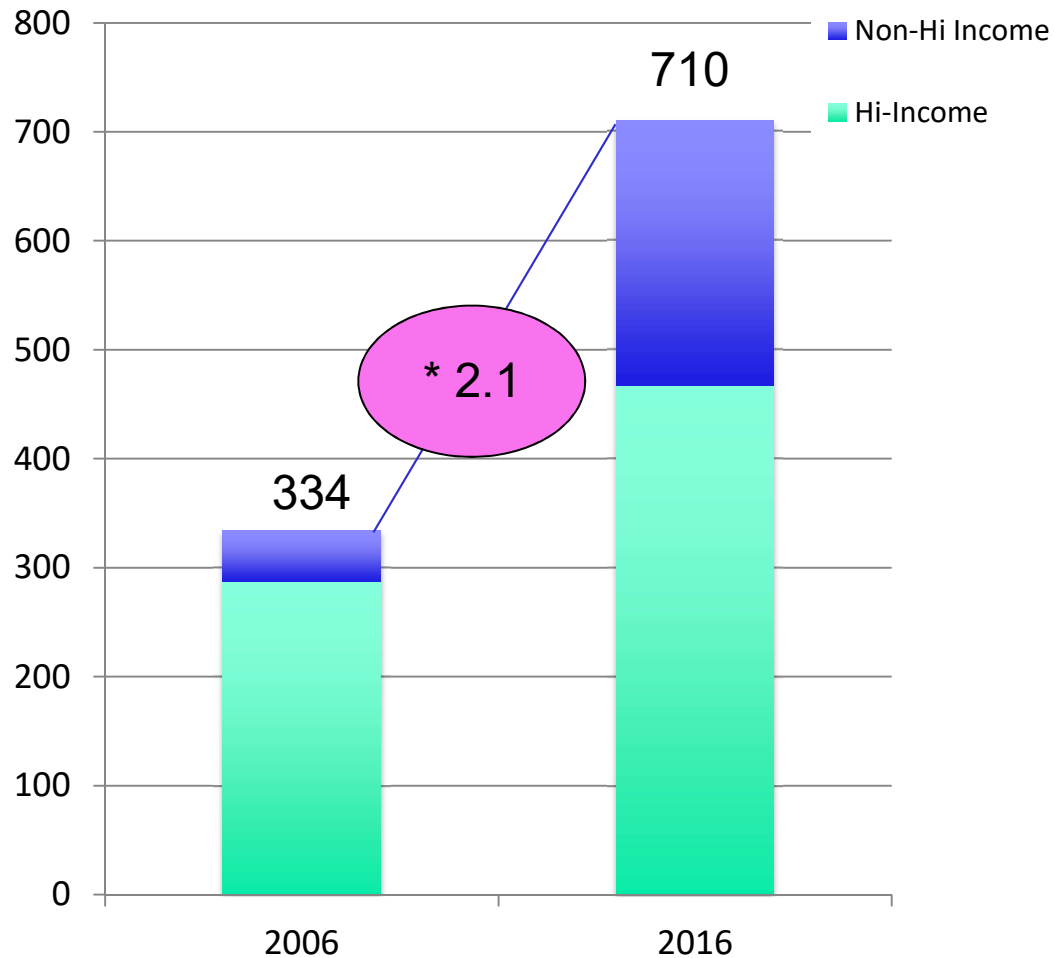
IIOA Evolution: Decade 2006-2016



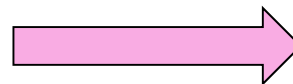

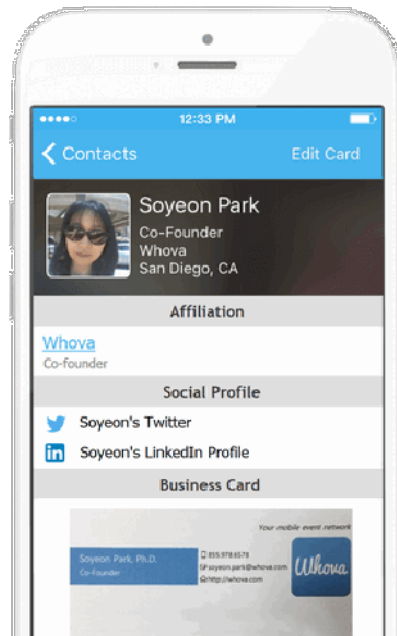



Financial Report

IIOA Financials 2016



- For 2016, IIOA shows a **surplus** of US\$5,044.
- US\$ 5,700 Non-Members Surcharge from **Seoul Conference**.
- **Royalties steady** at just below US\$ 38,000.-
- **Institutional Membership** slightly down at around US\$10,400.
- **Private Membership** contributions decreased to US\$10,300 from a spike of US\$13,800 in 2015. They come in waves as members tend to lump payments.
- **Council Travel** expenditures low at US\$6,500.-, much lower than expected.
- **ISIOA** expenditures low at US\$2,000.
- **IT Expenditures** with US\$ 8,900.- above regular levels due to security update and 9 enhancements aimed at reducing no-shows and better conference management.
- **Travel Grants remain high** of almost **US\$30,000**.
- **New Sponsorship** of the REAL Prize for Flash Sessions: US\$300, 1:1 matched by IIOA.

Outlook 2017



- Revenues and expenditures **both will double** due to IIOA Conference in our own books.
- Based on very **conservative estimates** (ISIOA costs at max. level, Council travel increased to typical level, IT expenditure remains high) we expect a small deficit of US\$1,500.
- **If something goes wrong** with the conference, we will have a bigger drainage of assets.
- However, with **US\$180,000** of assets in the **war-chest** at the end of 2016, IIOA can even survive a massive deficit.
- - which would practically mean ***giving back money*** to the **IIOA community**, especially those actively involved at our conferences, and will have received ticket prices lower than their cost equivalent.

Approved by the ordinary General Assembly held on June 27, 2012

- Once in a while it becomes necessary to **change the Statutes**; a 2/3 majority of the General Assembly is needed. Last changes were applied in 2012: terms of council members were reduced from 9 to 3 years.
- These last changes bring about the **need to adapt** the rules on the **presidential and vice-presidential elections**

Proposed Change of Statutes (1)



- **§ 2 Objectives and purpose**

The main objective of the Association shall be the advancement of research in and teaching of all areas of input-output analysis. The Association shall also promote the integration and use of input-output applications and techniques in other scientific disciplines.

The Association shall be non-profit making, its sole aim being the achievement of non-profit purposes as set forth in these statutes.

These objectives shall be achieved by:

1) Promoting the exchange of scientific experience between members of the Association.

.....

11) Undertaking educational and training activities

12) Carrying out any other activities that are expedient with respect to achieving the object of the Association.

Proposed Change of Statutes (2)



- **§ 11 The Council**

(11) After the election, the new Council shall elect a President and two Vice-Presidents from among the nine members elected. They shall represent the Council to the outside. The President's and the Vice-Presidents' term of office shall also commence on January 1; they shall serve for three years. The President and the Vice-Presidents may be re-elected only once.

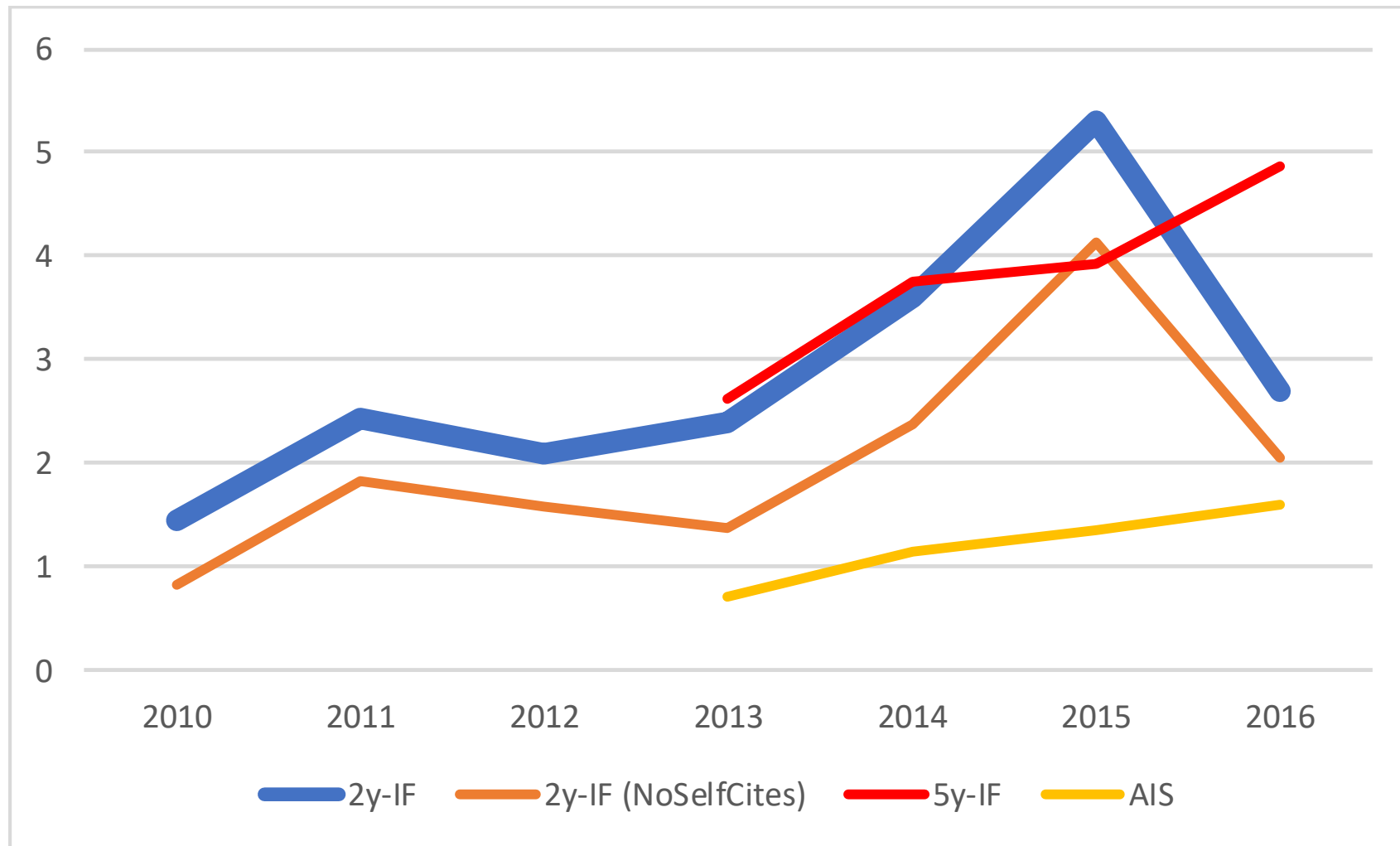
(11) The Council shall elect a President to a three year term from among those members of the IIOA who are currently serving or have served as elected members on Council within the past 10 years. This election shall be conducted as soon as possible after the election of Council members. If the elected President is not a current member of Council, he or she will be appointed to Council for the term of his or her service. The President may be re-elected only once. The President's term of office shall commence on January 1.

(12) Upon election, the President nominates two candidates for Vice-President from the elected members of Council for a term of one year. They must be confirmed by Council before they perform their duties. The Vice-Presidents may be re-elected for an indefinite number of terms. The Vice-Presidents' terms of office shall commence on January 1.

(13) President and Vice-Presidents shall represent the Council to the wider public.

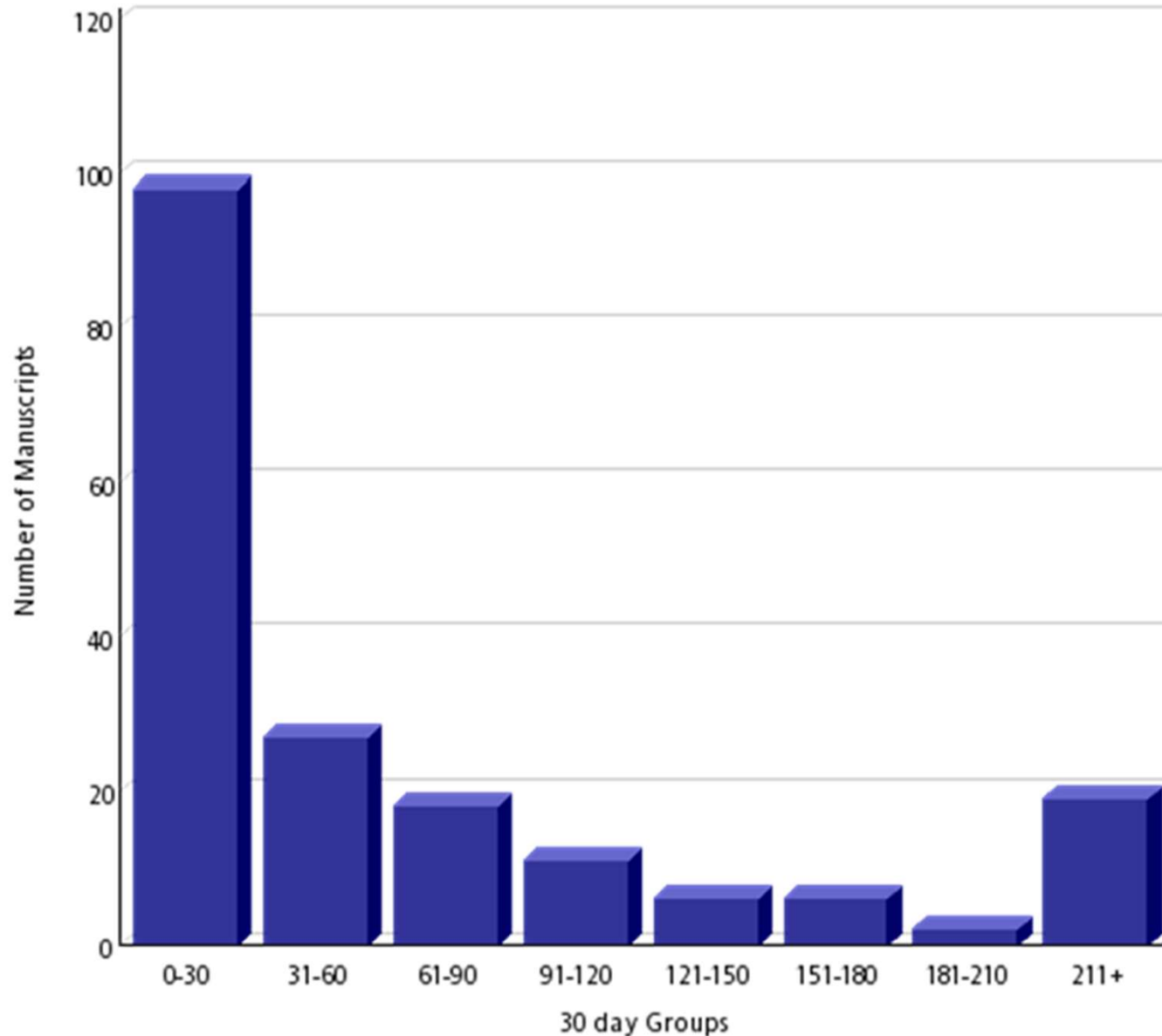

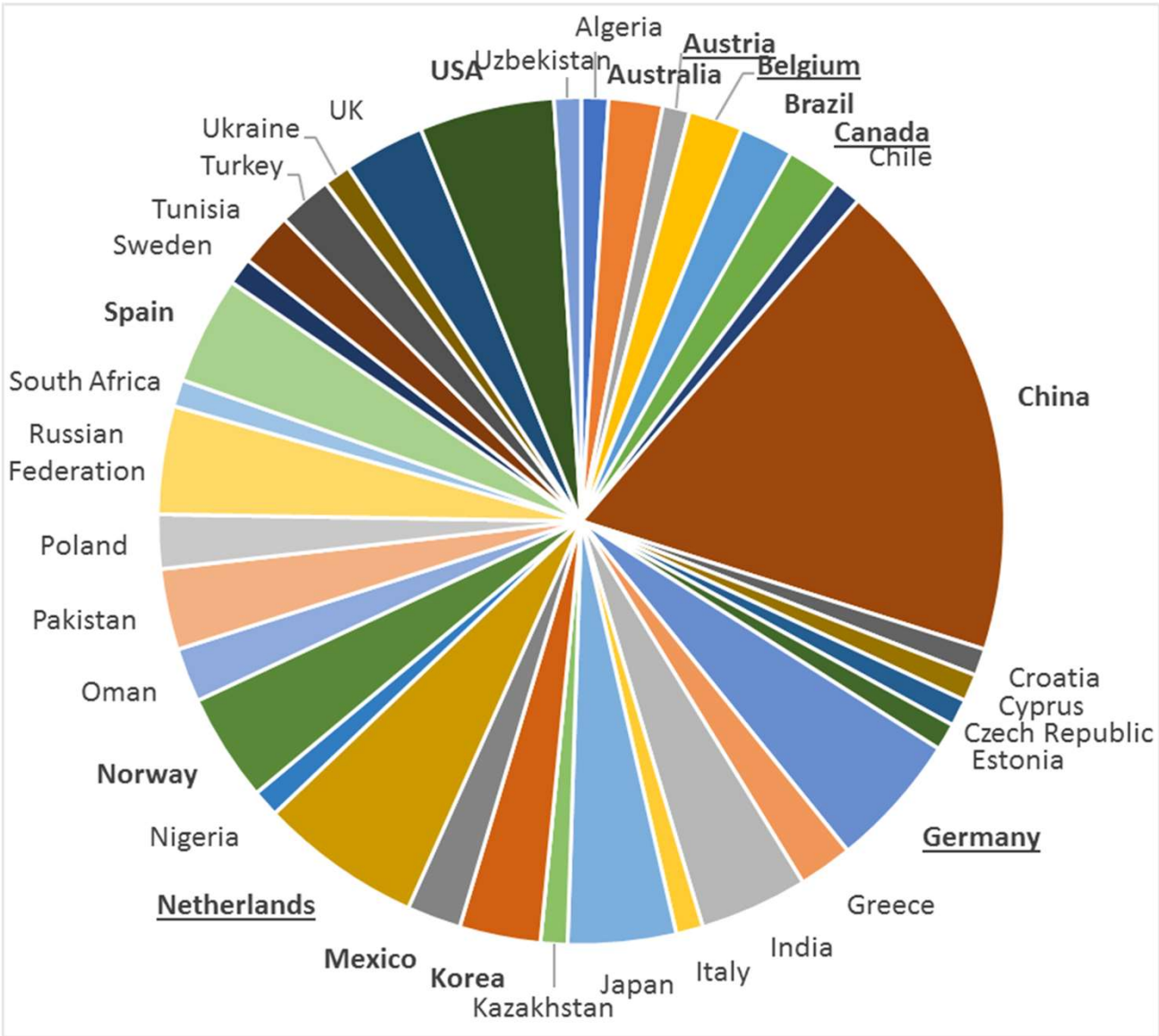

Applications and Evaluation Process

- 8 applications received:
 - 2 methodological papers, while mostly policy relevant papers
- An Evaluation Jury with 5 committee members:
 - Each paper is reviewed and scored by three referees, in terms of its each Novelty, Clarity and overall score ranging from 1 (low) to 5 (high).

Results

- The average scores of the 8 papers are **not higher than 3**. What was basically lacking was *novelty*, be it new methods, new data, or new applications.
- Quality of the papers was **not good enough** to award the Leontief Prize in 2017.

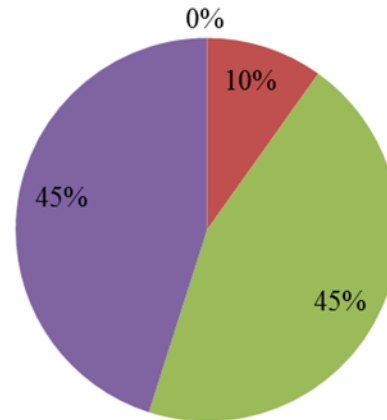

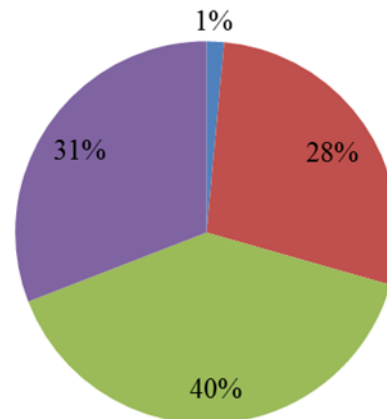

Juiz de Fora is a Brazilian city in the state of Minas Gerais, located at southeast of the state capital (Belo Horizonte), about 280 km. Its population in 2010, according to census, was about 516,247 inhabitants (Brazilian Institute of Geography and Statistics - IBGE), so being the fourth most populous of Minas Gerais and the 36th in Brazil. Federal University of Juiz de Fora is located in Juiz de Fora, Minas Gerais state which is approximately 180 kilometers north of Rio de Janeiro city, Rio de Janeiro state.

- ***Via Rio de Janeiro*** -Those wishing to fly into the International Airport of Rio de Janeiro – Galeão can take a Shuttle bus for Juiz de Fora that will be available on the previous, before first and after the last day of the conference.

The International Airport of Rio de Janeiro – Galeão is served by AirFrance, Alitalia, American Airlines, Avianca, British Airways, Continental Airlines, Copa Airlines, Delta Airlines, Emirates, Iberia, KLM, Lan, Lufthansa, TAAG, Taca Peru, TAP, United Airlines and US Airways.

The majority of flights arrive early in the morning at Rio de Janeiro. **Thus, the shuttle bus for Juiz de Fora will departure from the International Airport of Rio de Janeiro.**

- ***Via Juiz de Fora*** - Those wishing to fly into the Juiz de Fora Airport (Aeroporto Regional Presidente Itamar Augusto Cautieiro Franco) can, then, rent a car and drive to Juiz de Fora or take the Shuttle Bus (José Maria Rodrigues - <http://www.josemariarodrigues.com.br/conexao-aeroporto.html>) or a Taxi.

This airport is located approximately 40 kilometers from Juiz de Fora downtown and is served by Azul Linhas Aéreas (www.voeazul.com.br) and Gol Linhas Aéreas (www.voegol.com.br). Those air companies offer flights to International Airport of Viracopos and Congonhas Airport at São Paulo. From Viracopos you will have flight connections to United States and Europe.

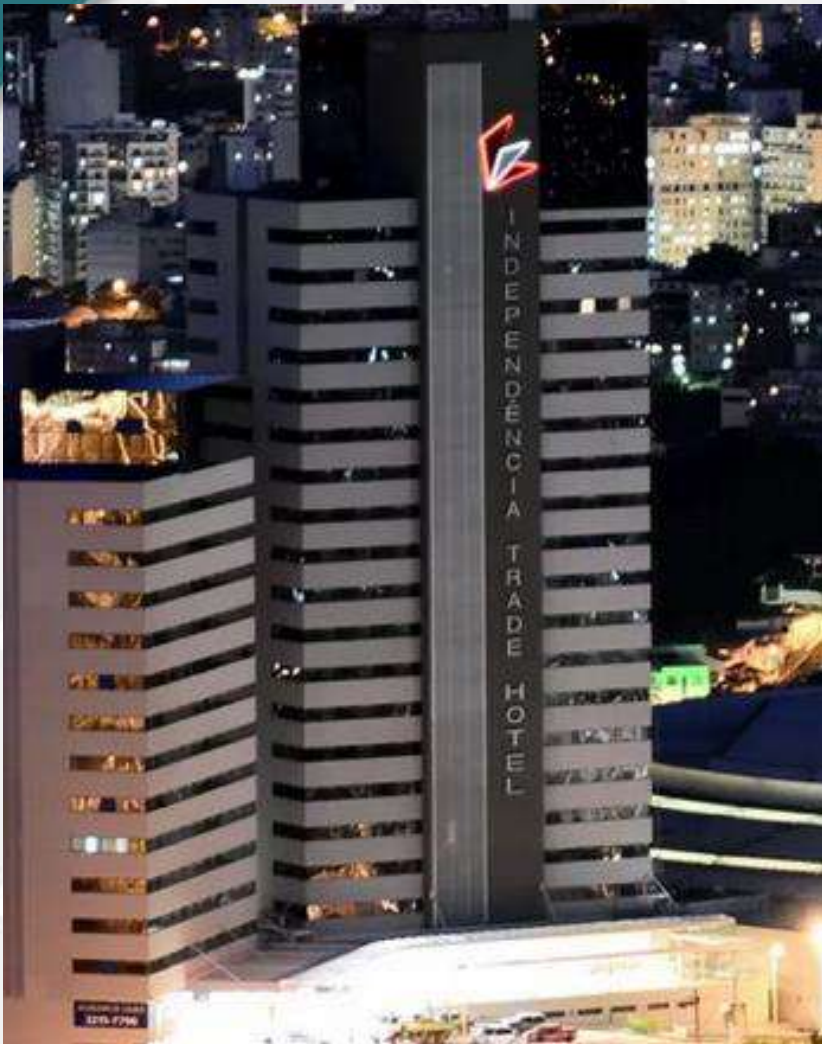

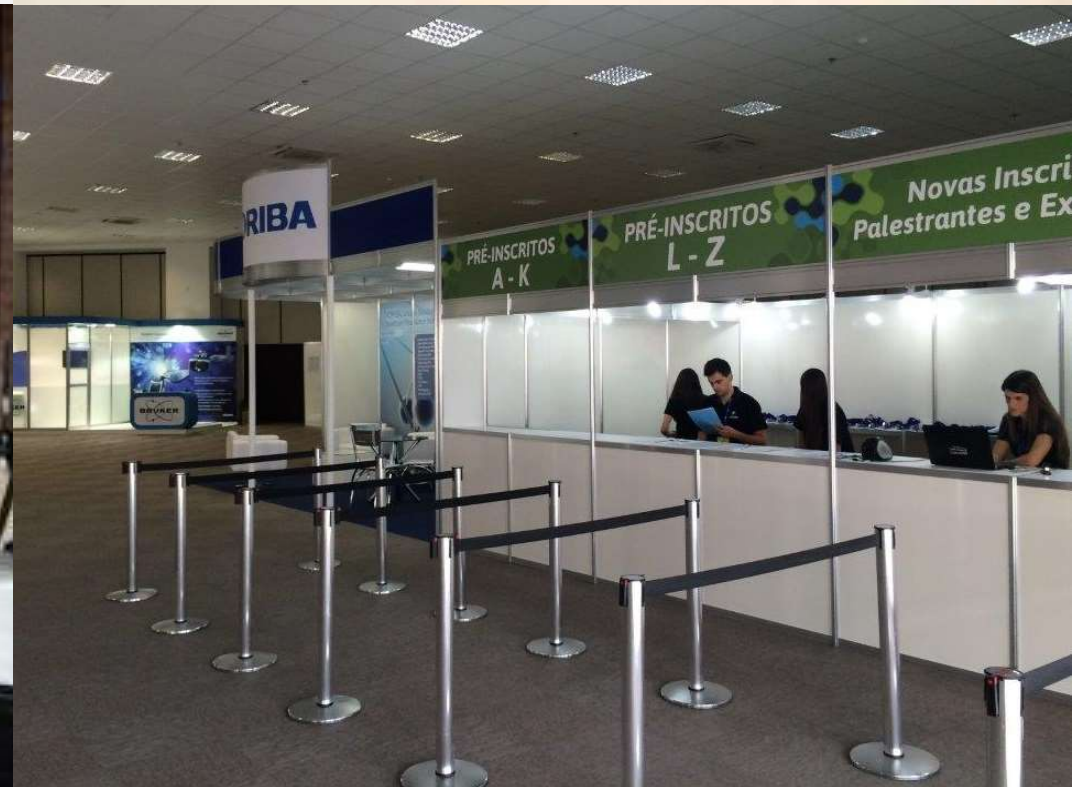

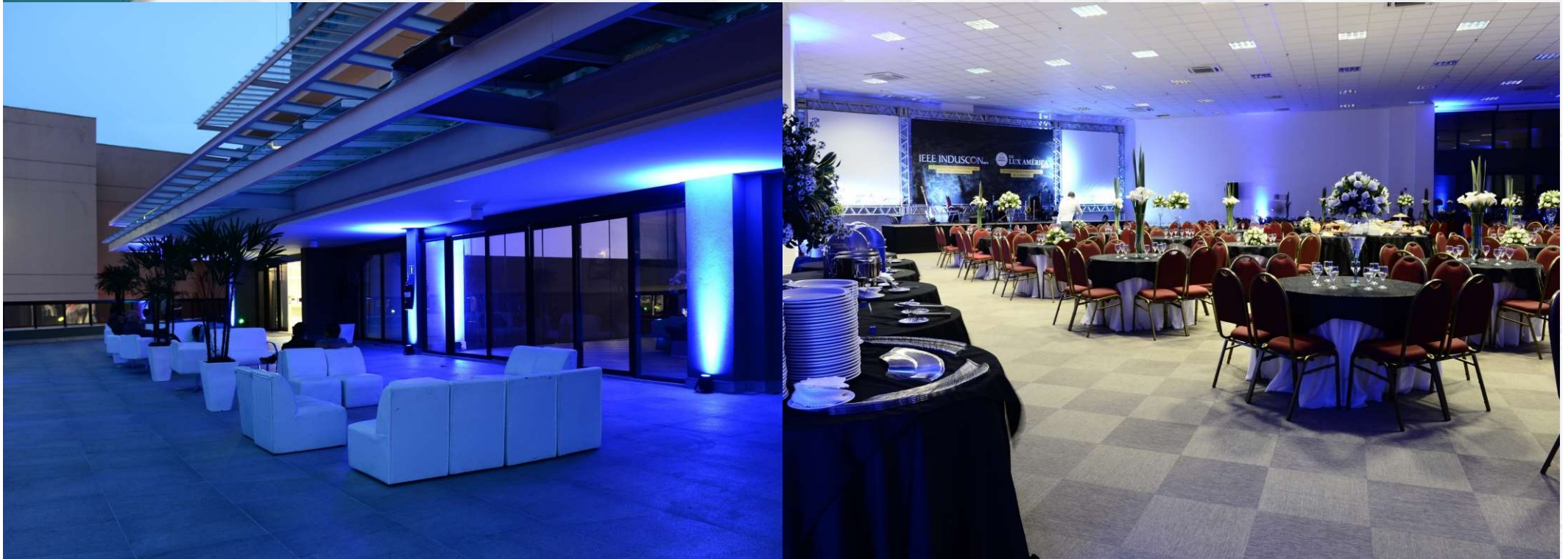
