
IIOA Evolution: 2006-2018







Financial Report

IIOA Financials 2017



- For 2017, IIOA shows a tiny surplus of US\$1,700 instead of an expected loss.
- Surplus of over US\$ 4,000 from AC Conference.
- Royalties steady at US\$ 38,000.-
- Institutional Membership increased to over US\$12,000.
- Private Membership contributions increased to US\$15,200. They come in waves as members tend to lump payments.
- Council Travel expenditures lower than expected at US\$14,000.-
- ISIOA expenditures low at US\$2,000.
- IT Expenditures with US\$ 17,000.- are above regular levels. They include the overhaul of IIOA Members Area, ISIOA website restructuring, WHOVA App rental and data interfacing, COPASS enhancements for systems integration.
- Travel Grants remained high at US\$25,000.
- New Sponsorship of the REAL Prize for Flash Sessions: US\$300, 1:1 matched by IIOA.

Outlook 2018




- Revenues and expenditures will drop back to regular levels, as before 2017.
- No major organizational overhauls are planned.
- Based on conservative estimates (ISIOA costs at moderate level, Council travel constant, IT expenditure high) we expect a tiny surplus of below US\$100.

The 2016 Thomson Reuters Impact Factors for *Economic Systems Research* is 2.691. This decrease from its 2015 high was expected because of a number of Special Issue articles dropping off from the count. The five-year impact factor though has been increasing and now stands at 4.864.

Submission and decision statistics

Between 1 January 2017 and 1 January 2018: 127 submissions,

40 (31.5%) accepted, 87 (68.5%) were rejected.

This is in line with acceptance-rejection ratios in previous years and includes special issues in which papers are rarely rejected.




In 2017, large number of submissions from Spain (36), followed by China (32), Japan (22), the USA (21), Australia (17), Austria and the UK (both 11) and Brazil and Germany (10 each; Fig. 2).

The journal continues to attract submissions from countries within which the Association is not particularly active, such as Nigeria, Saudi Arabia, Slovenia and Romania.




Submission processing time







Background and state of play with the UN Handbook

- Need to update present UN Handbook (1999) based on SNA 1993.
- Reflect new SNA, BPM, SEEA, ISIC, CPC, etc.
- UNSD formally started revision process in January 2013.
- Editorial Board / Expert Group in place (April 2013) led by UNSD.
 - 12 members plus UNSD Editor, Sanjiv Mahajan (ONS, UK).
 - Leading international experts with decades of experience.
 - Mix of members from different continents, IIOA, academia, NSOs, etc.
 - All members contributed Joerg Beutel, huge effort on formatting charts, etc.
- 21 Chapters plus references etc.
- Global Consultation in August-November 2017.
- Major effort just over 600 pages.

- Title
 - UN Handbook on Supply, Use and Input-Output Tables with Extensions and Applications
- Summary of aims
 - Consistency with SNA 2008, BPM 6, SEEA and ISIC Revision 4.
 - Focus on the evolution of SUTs.
 - Recommend guidelines / best practice and acceptable alternatives.
 - Integration theme using the "H-Approach":
 - SUTs produced at the heart / core of National Accounts.
 - SUTs in CP and PYPs alongside IOTs, EE-IOTs.
 - Focus on use of GSBPM and IES.
 - Minimal overlap with other Handbooks / Manuals, e.g. Globalisation.
 - Terminology improvements, e.g. no use of "symmetric"


