


IIOA Membership as of July 2013: 618 Persons, 65 Countries





IIOA Membership by Type






IIOA Membership by Gender








IIOA Membership by Birth Year



Operationalizing the Phased Approach Framework for Compiling the SUT for 18 Economies in Asia and the Pacific








Lifetime Total Likes - Lifetime The total number of people who have liked your Page. (Unique Users)



Facebook: Daily Reach




Daily Total Reach - Daily The number of people who have seen any content associated with your Page. (Unique Users)



Facebook: Monthly Reach




28 Days Total Reach - 28 days The number of people who have seen any content associated with your Page. (Unique Users)

IIOA Financials 2012



- In 2012, IIOA is back to normal after having taken 2011 IIOA
 conference into its books: total flows in the accounts are much lower than in 2011.
- Stable private and institutional contribution streams.
- Royalties remain high at ca. US\$ 40,000
- Non-member surcharge revenues from the very successful Bratislava conference exceed expectations.
- Billing of outstanding Editorial costs for ESR get delayed to
 2013. Good news: due to the renewed contract, all future editorial costs will be paid by the Publishing House Taylor & Francis.
- Overall: visible surplus in 2012.


2012 IIOA Conference Bratislava



- 308 Registrations, 244 participants
 - of which: ca 70% IIOA Members
- 10% higher participation rate than usual in previous years
- High students' participation rate (18%)
- Larger diversity of participants' origins: 44 countries
- Higher female participation rate (34%, up from 27% in 2011)
- Success: big demand for the courses of the International School of Input-Output in its teaching program!


2013 IIOA Conference Kitakyushu



- 269 Sign-Ups (308 in 2012), resulting in:
- 233 Participants (244 in 2012) of which:
 - 64% are IIOA Members
 - II% are students (18% in 2012)
 - 61% Early Bird Registrations
 - 23% signed up in the last 2 days before Early-Bird rates would expire
 - Female participation rate 27% (compare: 34% in 2012, 27% in 2011)
 - 84 Non-Members are now entitled to a free 2-year membership!
- Success: again big demand for the courses of the International School of Input-Output (ISIOA).


