


IIOA Membership 2010 and 2022

IIOA Membership as of 1 Sep 2022: 819 Persons, 64 Countries



Financial Report

IIOA Financials 2021



- For 2021, IIOA shows a marked **surplus** of over US\$ 60,000 as the biggest expenditure items vanish:
 - No Travel Grants.
 - No Council Travel.
- Expenditure on **Audits** covers 2 fiscal years, on **Legal Advisory** re. IP-protection regarding the IO Archiving Project: US\$ 5,000.
- **ESR editorial work** continues to be routed through IIOA books. Reason for this change: Records revealed that for 2013-17 not all agreed payments to our editors had been made by our publisher!
 - Result: both income and expenditure of IIOA systematically increase by US\$ 20,000 p.a.
- **No Conference Surplus.**
- **Royalties continue high** at over US\$ 48,700.
- **Institutional Membership** revenues high at US\$19,000 as members paid arrears
- **Private Membership** contributions rebound to close to US\$16,000.
- **ISIOA** expenditures manifest only in Webinar costs (part of IT/Webdesign).
- **IT Expenditures** with US\$ 5,000.- **below** expected levels even though heavy digitalization took place: of webinar lectures, MS-Teams Council Meetings. Smart restructuring and integration of IIOA systems before the pandemic pays off!
- **Prizes and Awards** at regular level US\$ 1,000.

Outlook on Finances 2022




- We compute a low **Non-Members Surcharge** Contribution from Langkawi Conference of max. US\$ 2,300. Please Note: In case the conference runs a deficit, IIOA supports the LOC financially.
- **Banking Charges** will rise due to an accounting technical effect: **Paypal** transaction fees will be made explicit! Paypal starts to become used for pay-outs, not just collection of membership payments, therefore full accounting operations for Paypal account.
- **Private and Institutional Membership** contributions estimated at average of past years.
- **Travel grants** to engage young scholars will double. Cooperation with YSI Programme: joint grants.
- **Administration:** additional support has been engaged to help with IO Archive database management, website reviews, social media. Increase to US\$ 4,500.
- Based on conservative **estimates** we expect a **deficit** of around US\$14,000. It implies **giving back money** to the IIOA Members' community.





The idea is to fully exploit the potential of the city of Alghero, by not concentrating activities in a convention center or in a hotel, but using different poles.

The facilities are all equipped for similar events and modular solutions have been provided depending on the number of participants.

The whole area involved in the conference, including coffee breaks and lunches, is enclosed in the area fortified by the old city walls, served by public transport and with parking lots (even free) nearby.

The structures identified are Ex-Ospedale Santa Chiara; Lo Quarter; Teatro Civico.

Maximum distance 700 m/9' walking in the pedestrian area.






Article Downloads - Usage by Country & Region



Full Text Downloads by Region




Full Text Downloads by Country






Origin of Submissions

Average Speed of Article Publication*







IO (Historical) Archive

Aims of the project



Short-term goal

To **preserve** relevant materials on the early stages of IO analysis that will otherwise be lost forever.

Long-term goal

To create a **knowledge repository** for IO-related materials and the history of IO statistics and IO analysis.

The IO (historical) archive could play an **important role** to **make IO** (and the IIOA) **more attractive** to economists and scientists in related areas.

General principles and characteristics



- The focus of the IO (historical) archive should be on materials which can be **made available in digital** form.
- IO should be seen in a **wider sense** to include related areas such as regional economics, environmental economics and mathematical economics, as well as various satellite accounts extending the IO framework.
- **Efficient search mechanisms** need to be provided.
- All materials should be made **easily accessible**.
- **No duplication of efforts**. Cooperation with other scientific organizations with similar projects should be achieved.

General principles and characteristics

What should be collected?

Material from the **early days of IO analysis**, such as

- o scientific publications, working papers, dissertations,
- o pictures, videos, interviews,
- o data, IO tables, SUT, SAMs, etc

Key criteria

Highly **relevant**

Not already available in digital form

Difficult to locate

Organisational aspects



The need to safeguard the scientific heritage of IO as a discipline has been discussed among members for several years.

Concrete activities started in spring 2021 based on a Council decision of May 7, 2021.

Rossella Bardazzi was nominated as the contact person responsible for the coordination.

Josef Richter and Bert Steenge were appointed as “archive planners” and were asked to get started.

The May edition of the Newsletter informed the IIOA membership about the initiative.

What was achieved




- Contacts with many pioneers were established; many of the pioneers made valuable material available to us.
- Access to a number of private archives was gained.
- Many relevant documents (about 1000) have already been digitized.
- The prototype of an efficient infrastructure (a web-database) was created to make the material available to members.

The integration of the digitized materials into the web-database has already begun.

Since comprehensive proceedings for the conferences held in **1950, 1954, 1961 and 1968** are available in **book** form, the additions for the period from 1971 to 1993 **close the gap** to the contributions to the conferences **already available** on the IIOA homepage.

What was **not** achieved



-
- Despite various efforts it was not possible to get in contact with a number of the pioneers.
 - Friendly contacts with officers of institutions active in related fields were established, but so far, no cooperation agreements have been concluded.
 - It has not yet been possible to find a **library** that can guarantee the safe storage of important printed material over long periods and at the same time is prepared to make this material available to interested users. Such a “safe haven” would be a valuable addition to the provision of documents in electronic form.

Next steps



- Clarification of a number of **copyright** issues
- Making the **web-database** fully operational
- **Call to members** to provide valuable material
- **Digitization of additional material** that is already available
- Making the archive **accessible** to IIOA members

IIOA Statutes

IIOA Legal Foundation



IIOA operations are based on two sets of rules:

- **Statutes** (current version 2017)
 - Define the objectives of the association, its institutions and functions (General Assembly, Council, President, management, etc.) and the rules of conduct (tasks and terms of functionaries, voting procedures, etc.)
 - To be submitted to the legal authorities in Austria for approval
 - To be changed only by the General Assembly

- **Bylaws**
 - Define operational procedures
 - Currently 5 sets of Bylaws: Council operations, council travel, travel grants, fellows, prizes
 - Bylaws for ISIOA in preparation
 - To be changed by the Council

Outdated § 11

In 2017 the **Statutes** had to be adapted in order to reflect the reduction of the terms of council members from 9 to 3 years -> change of §11(4)

- This included rules for a **transition period**
- This transition period has passed – all council members are now elected for 3 year terms.
- Consequently, the rules for the **transition period** are now redundant and can be **eliminated**

Section to be eliminated



Text to be eliminated in §11(4)

In order to ensure a smooth transition from the rules concerning the Council terms applicable until June 2012 to the currently applicable rules, the following addendum to §11(4) shall apply:

- *Of the four Council members elected for the term starting in 2013, three will serve for a five-year term (2013-2017); the member elected with the smallest number of votes will serve a three-year term (2013-2015).*
- *The three Council members elected for the term starting in 2016 will be elected for a four-year term (2016-2019).*
- *Starting with the 2018 term, three Council members shall be elected each year, for a three-year term each.*
