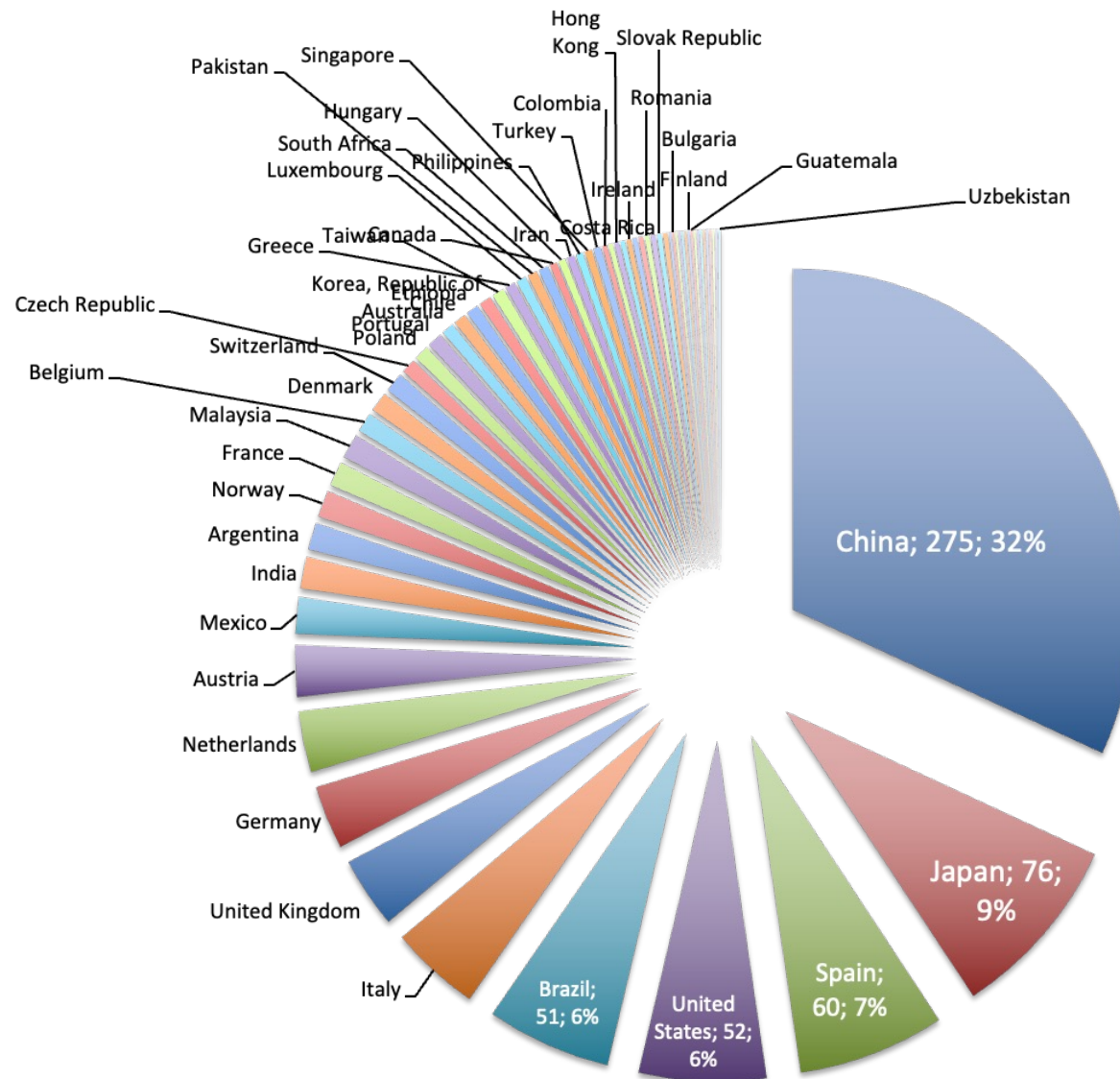

Members by Country Group and Activity

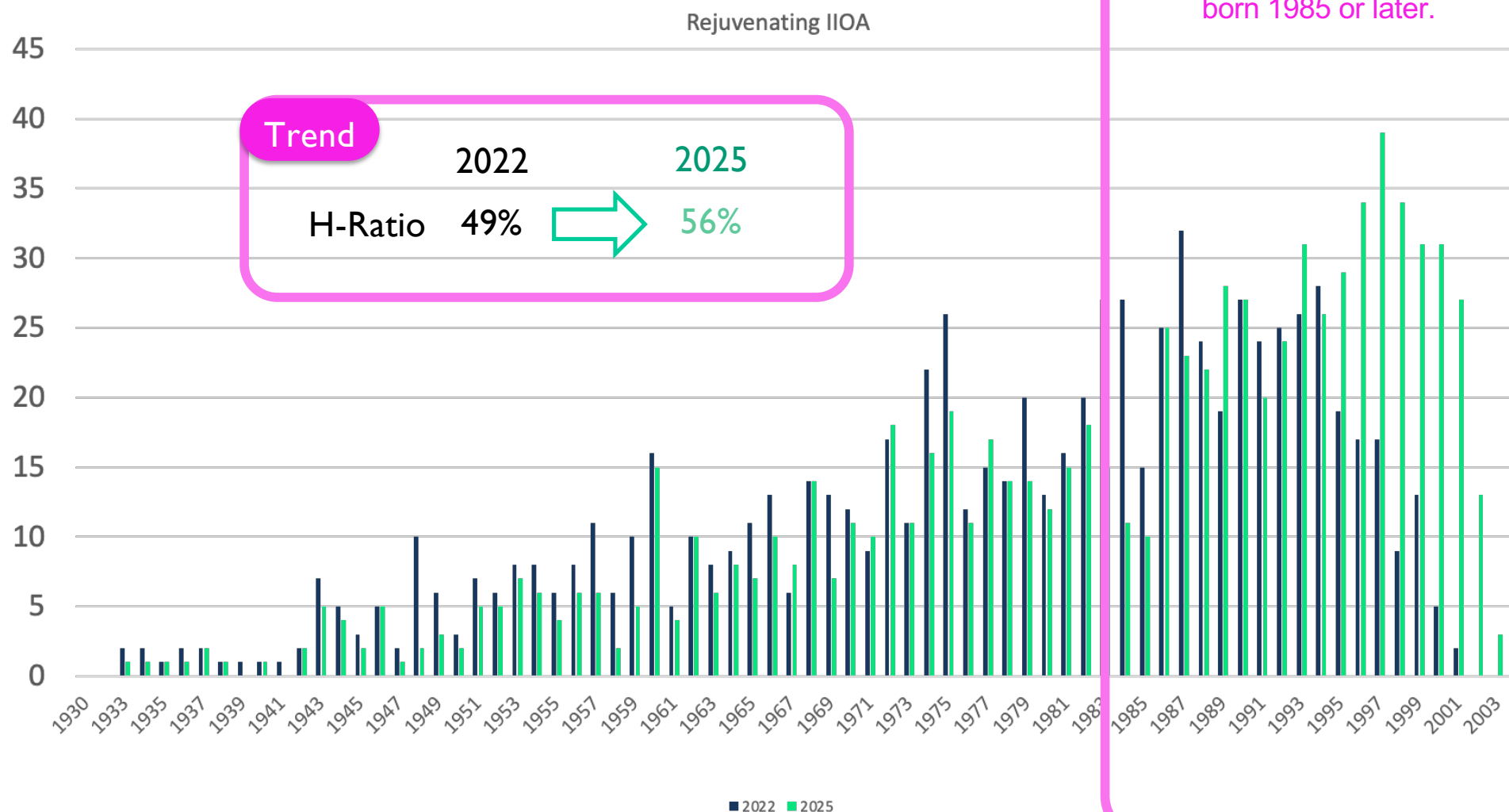


IIOA Membership as of 1 July 2025: 862 Persons, 65 Countries

Percentage of IIOA Members aged 40 and below



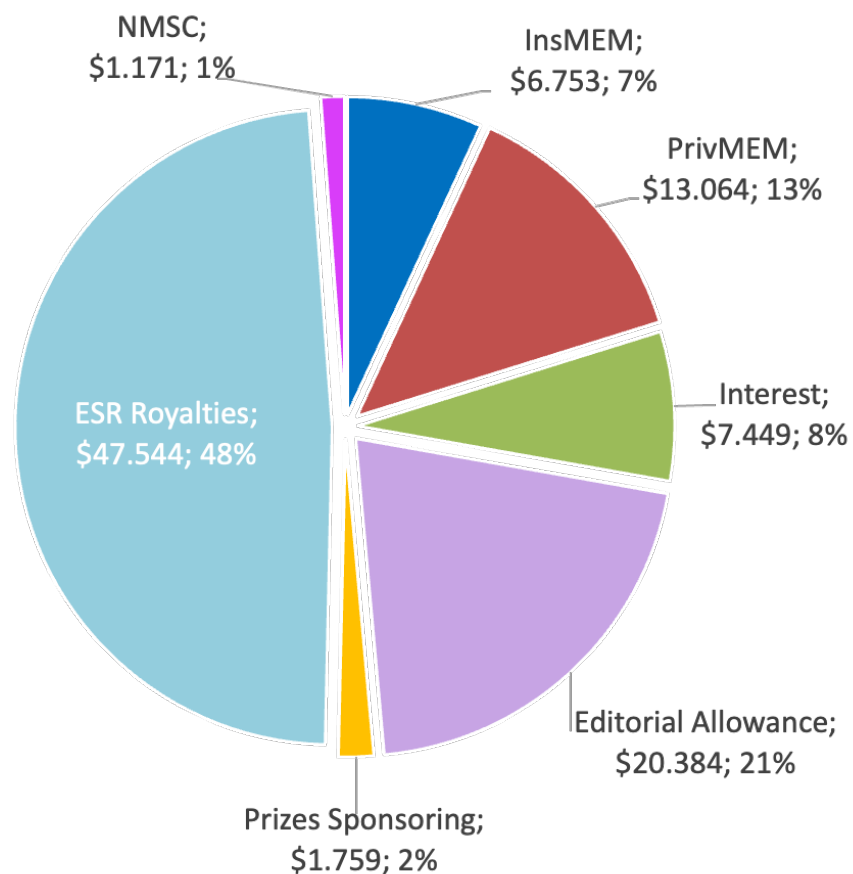
Financial Report

IIOA Financials 2024



- According to **Cash Accounting** IIOA year-end results show a **surplus of US\$20.700** which consists of **US\$ 20,000** in **arrears** for Editorial Works (2023 + 2024) due to necessary **legal contractual** steps.
- In **accrual** accounting the **surplus** amounts to **US\$700**. (“Balanced financial year”)
- **Royalties** for the ESR Journal **increased** by 17% to **US\$ 47.500**
- **Interest** revenues **increased** by 40% to **US\$7.200**.
- **Membership contributions** of private members fell to their 2019-level of **US\$ 13,000**.
- **Institutional Membership contributions**, fell to **US\$ 7,000** due to budget constraints in the public sector and some deferred payments. **Bank of Korea** and **Statistics Canada** cancelled their membership due to budget restrictions.
- A small **Non-Members Surcharge** of the Santiago conference added **US\$ 1.700.-**

Allowance by T%F.

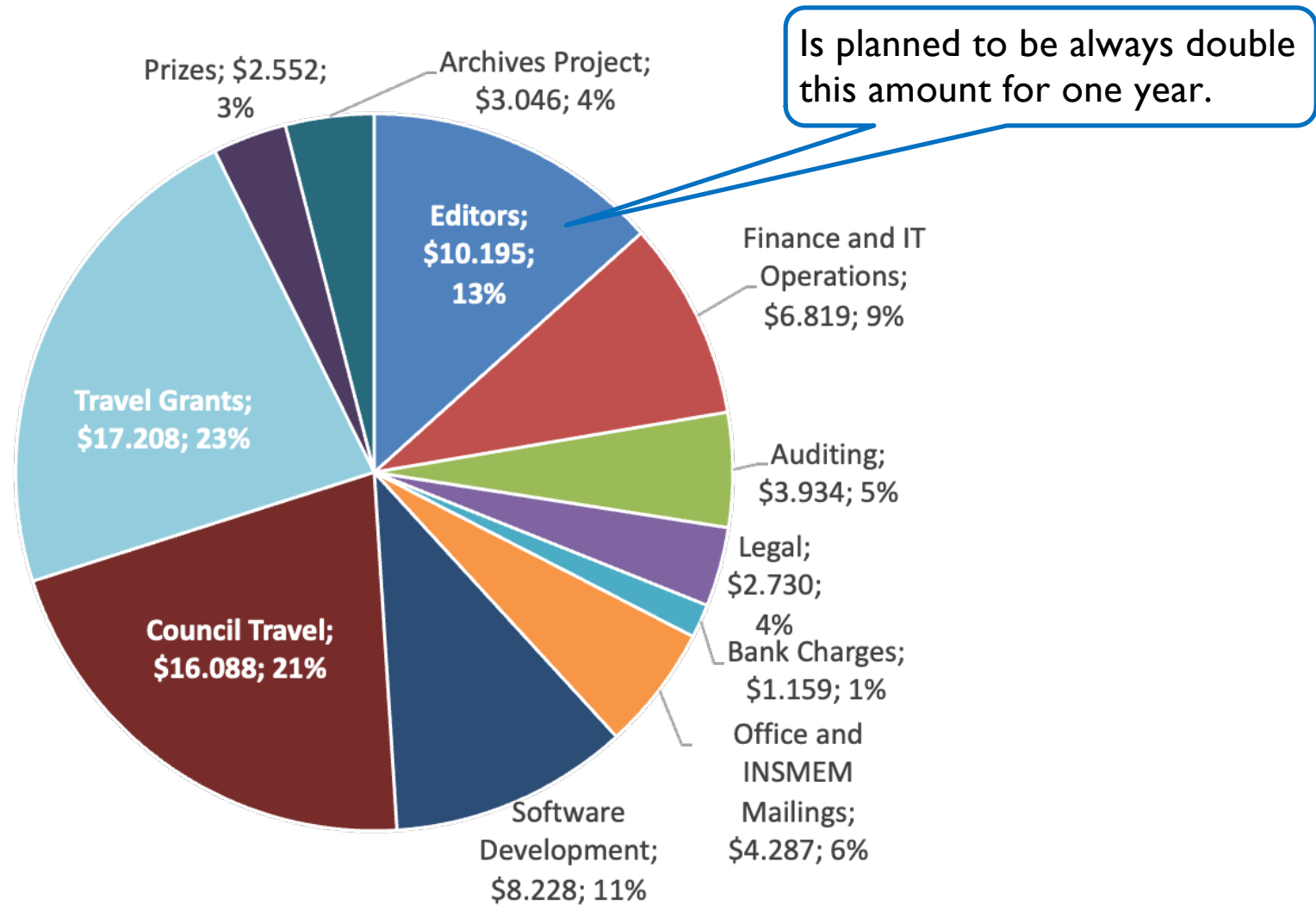
IIOA Financials 2024



- **Travel Grants** were co-sponsored by the YSI Programme and **thus resulted lower** at **US\$ 17.000**
- **Council Travel** increased due to the remote conference in Chile. **US\$ 16.000**
- **ESR Editors Allowance** paid out only **US\$ 10.000.-**, as the for one editor a contract needed to be setup first.
- The **IIOA Archive Project** created costs of over **US\$3.500.-** , which includes lawyers, document logistics, a salary for our Indian expert for data entry and validation.
- The **ISIOA School** has become popular. Trainers for the educational modules at the conference 2024 were **covered by the conference budget** and thus **indirectly carried** by the **lower NMSC revenues**.
- **IT service** expenditures dropped to **US\$ 8.000** but nevertheless delivered WEBADMIN, COPASS and CONFREG systems **enhancements**, website content hot-linkage, webinars management, and archives database development.
- **Legal advice** needed to be sought, and the **Auditing** expenditure paid for **two** fiscal year audits (2022, 2023). Total: ca. **US\$ 7.000**.
- **All other expenditures** were constant or lower than in years before, and are well in check.

2024 Quick Summary

1. **2024 was a good year** for IIOA, with a nice **UN-hosted conference** in Chile, 6 Council Meetings, creation of the **IIOA Code of Conduct, ISIOA Bylaws**, ...
2. There remains a **small surplus** (deviating only 7US\$ from the prediction) - after deduction of open arrears for *ESR Editorial Works*.
3. IIOA's **asset base** amounting to **US\$360.000** (accrual basis) continues to be **solid**.
4. To increase IIOA's **interest revenues** and contribute to **ecological transformation**, US\$21,000 have been invested in a SWIMSOL bond. SWIMSOL is a leading manufacturer of **swimming photovoltaic power plants**.



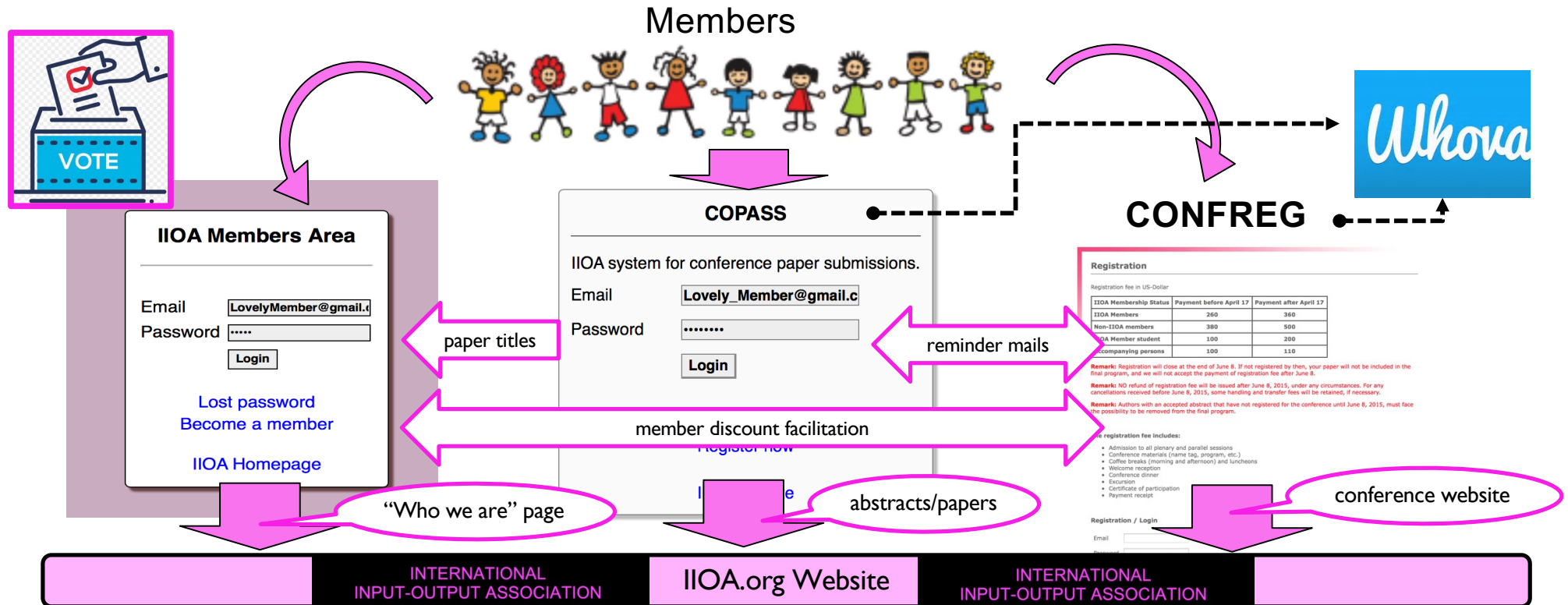
- **9% interest per annum**
- funds the energy transition of island economies (Maldives!).
- The project will save **1.3 million liters of diesel** and related CO2 emissions **per year**.
- Investment returns will fund **1 IIOA travel grant** per year. (ECO-Grant)

Outlook for 2025

- **Royalties** continue to grow to over **US\$ 49,000**.
- **Travel grants expenditure** will remain the highest expenditure item, and rocket up, since the YSI Programme was unable to contribute sponsoring due to public spending cuts in the USA. Estimated at **US\$ 39,000**.
- **Editorial Expenditure** will amount to **US\$ 30,000** in 2025, as arrears are paid back.
- **Editorial Works sponsoring** by T&F increase by 2% as agreed **US\$ 20,800**.
- **Interest** income estimated conservatively will be at **US\$ 7,000**.
- We conservatively estimate a **US\$ 2,500 Non-Members Surcharge** Contribution from the Male Conference.
- **Private and Institutional Membership** contributions estimated at somewhat below average of past years US\$ 25,000.
- **IT Costs:** expected to remain constant at **US\$8,000**.
- **IO Archive** project will continue: provision of **US\$ 5,000** for data entry and validation, legal support, shipment of rare physical archive originals to University of Oviedo.
- **ISIOA Trainings** are conservatively estimated to trigger cost at about **US\$ 5,000** this year.
- **Administration, Office Operations Costs:** expected constant.
- Based on all these **conservative estimates** we expect a **Deficit** of **US\$11,000**, which implies “giving back to the IIOA community”.

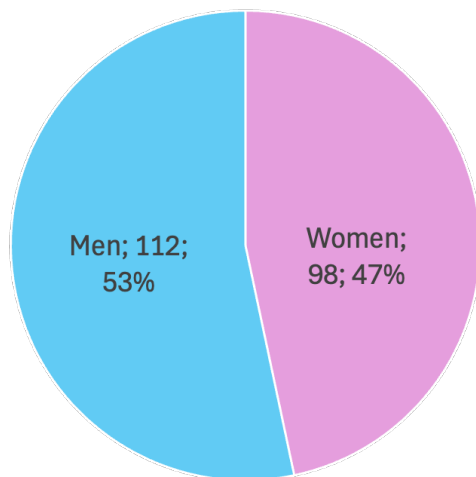

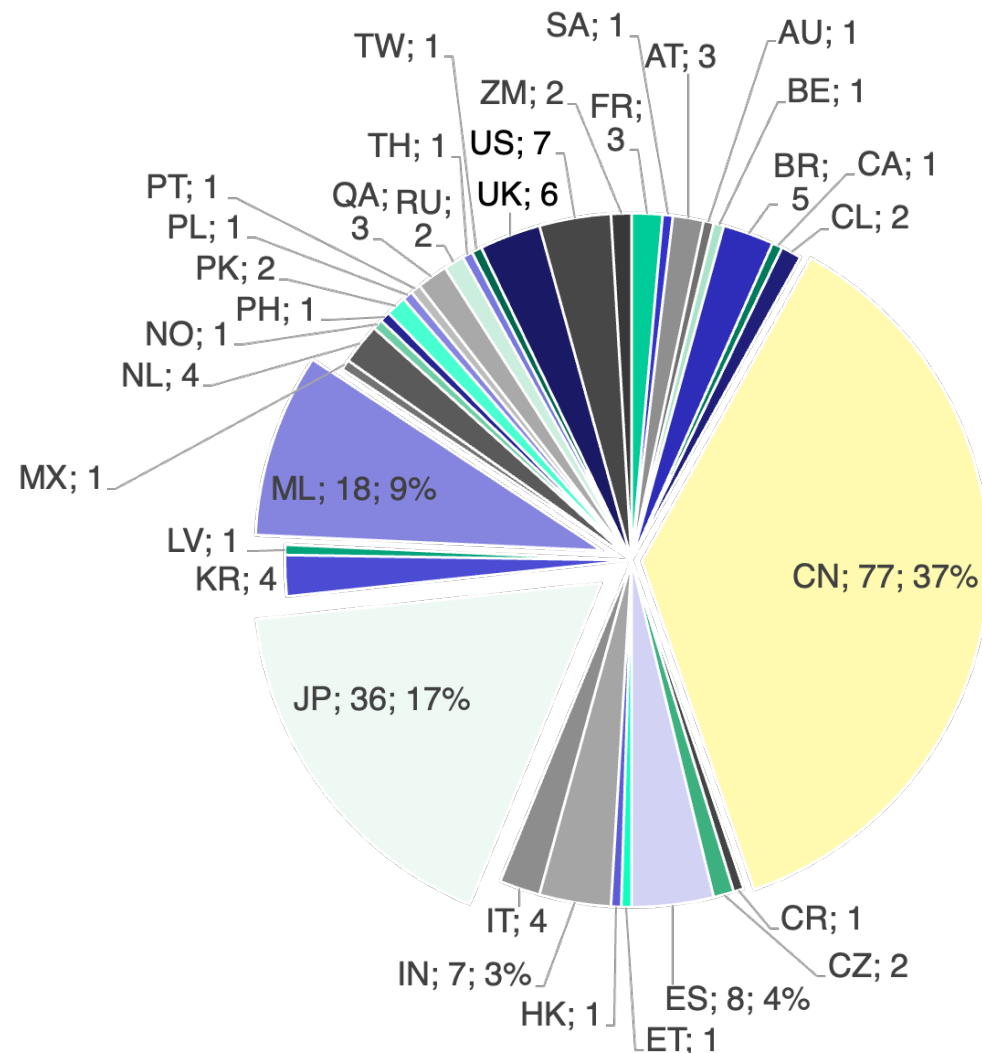

By gender



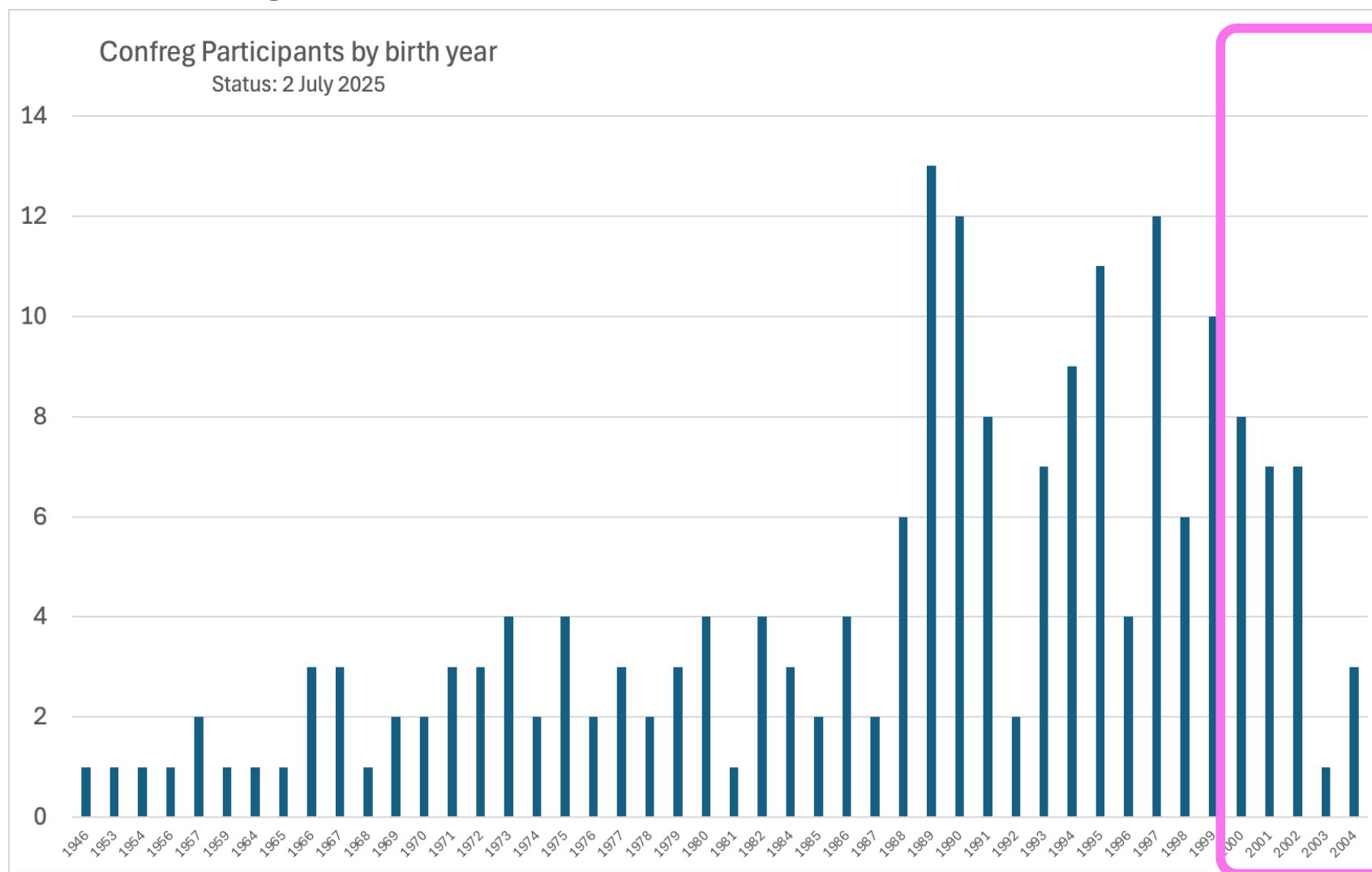
By nationality

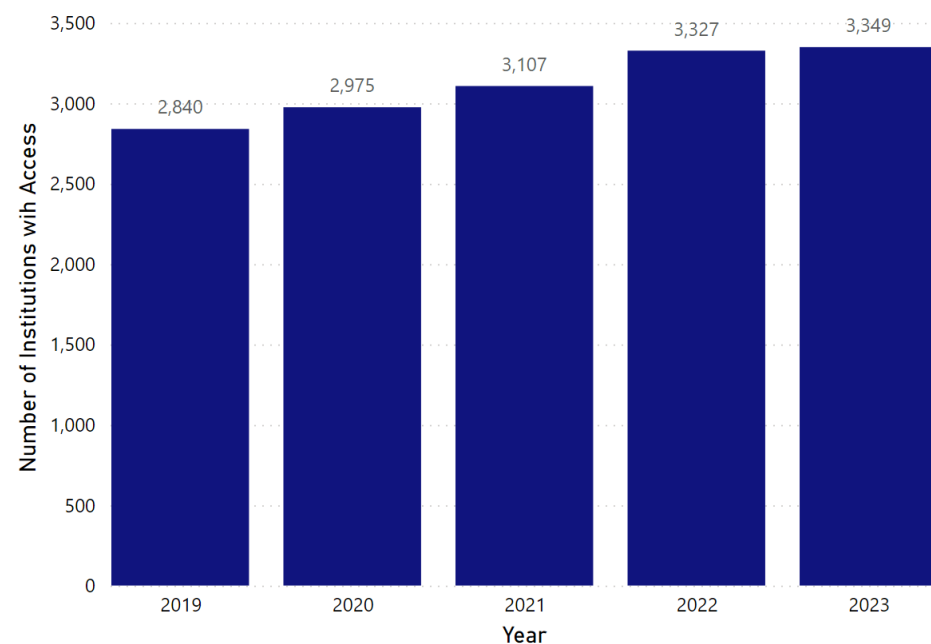

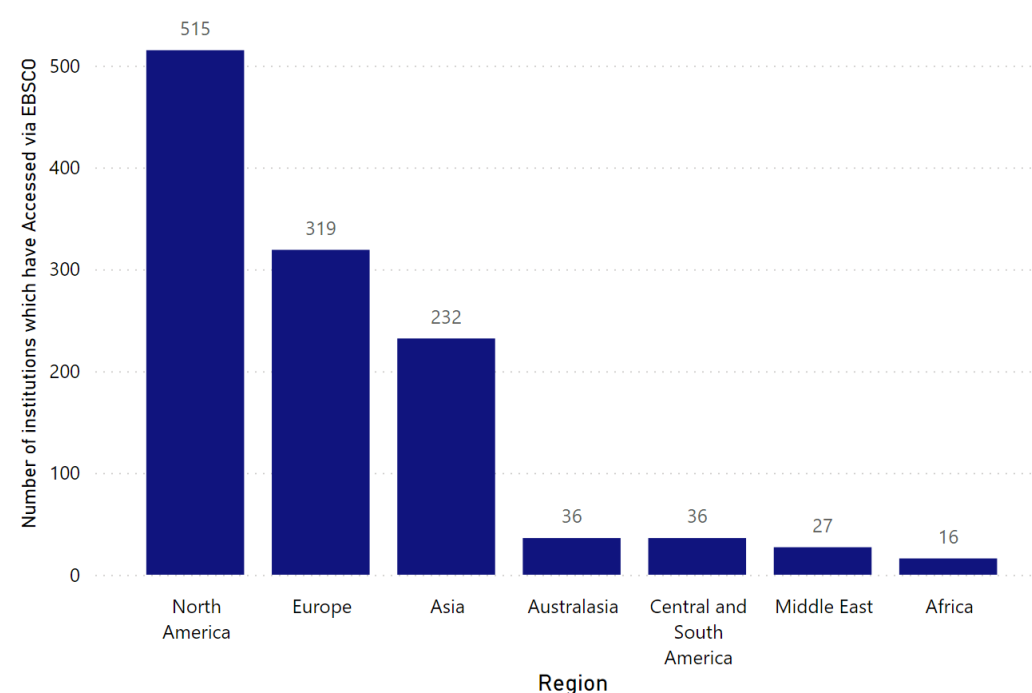

EBSCO Coverage 2024 by Region



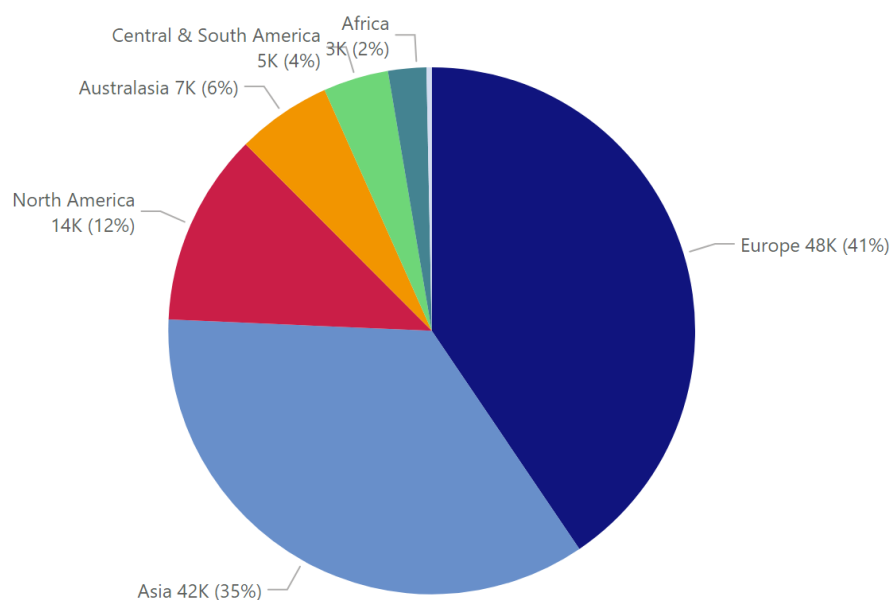

Article Downloads - Usage by Country & Region

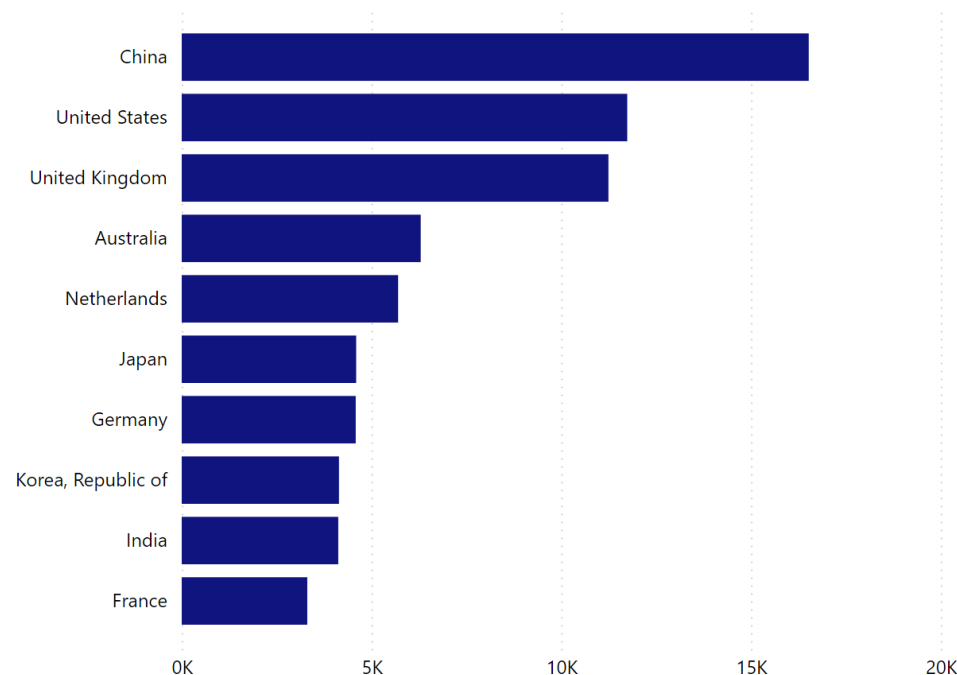

Full Text Downloads by Country

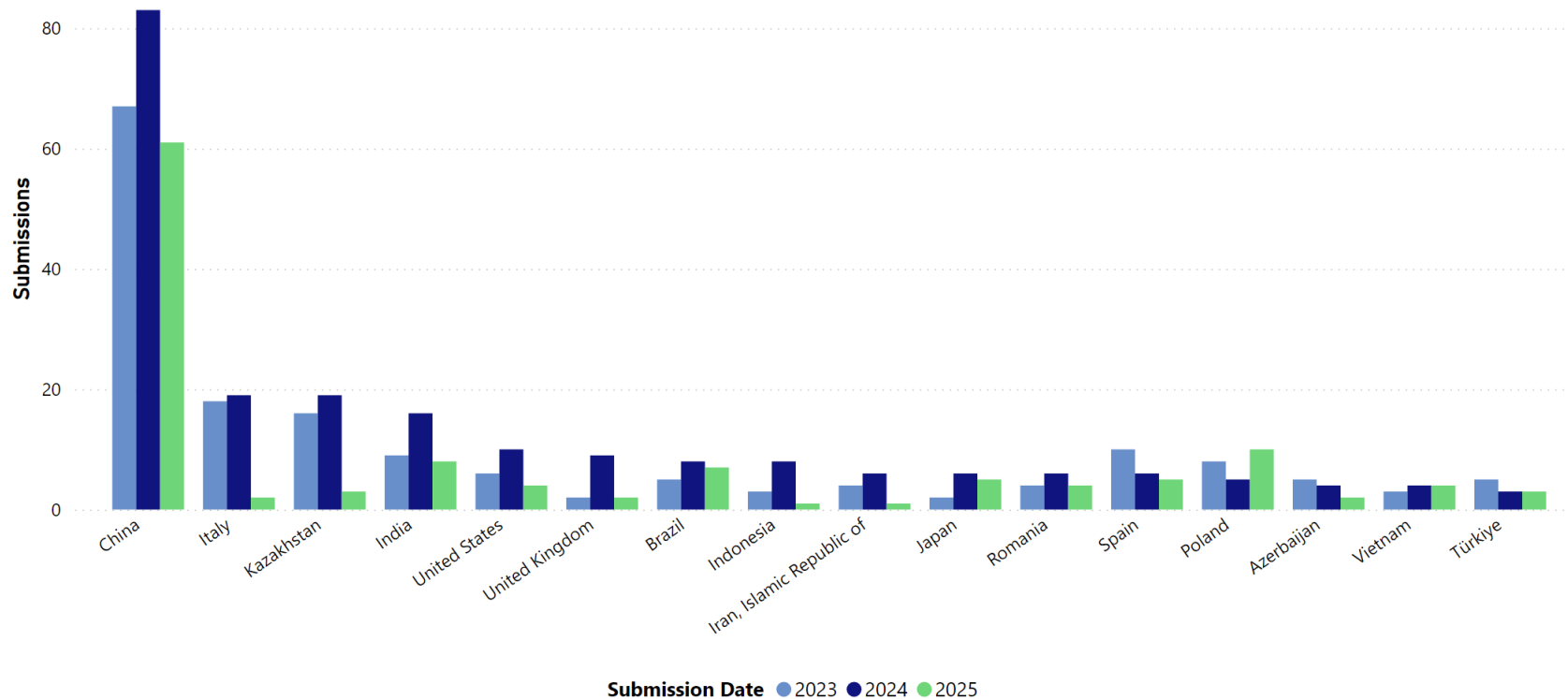

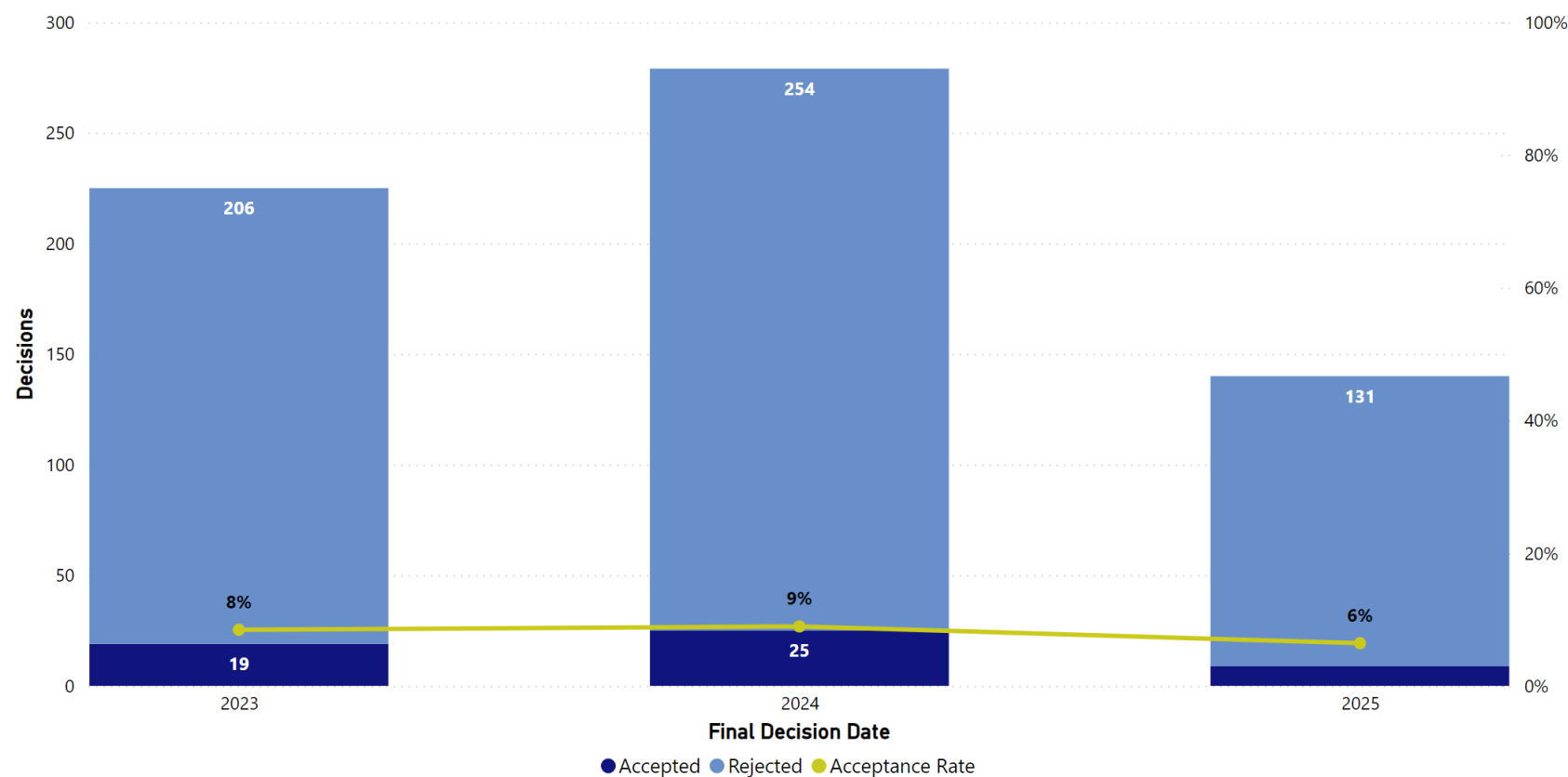

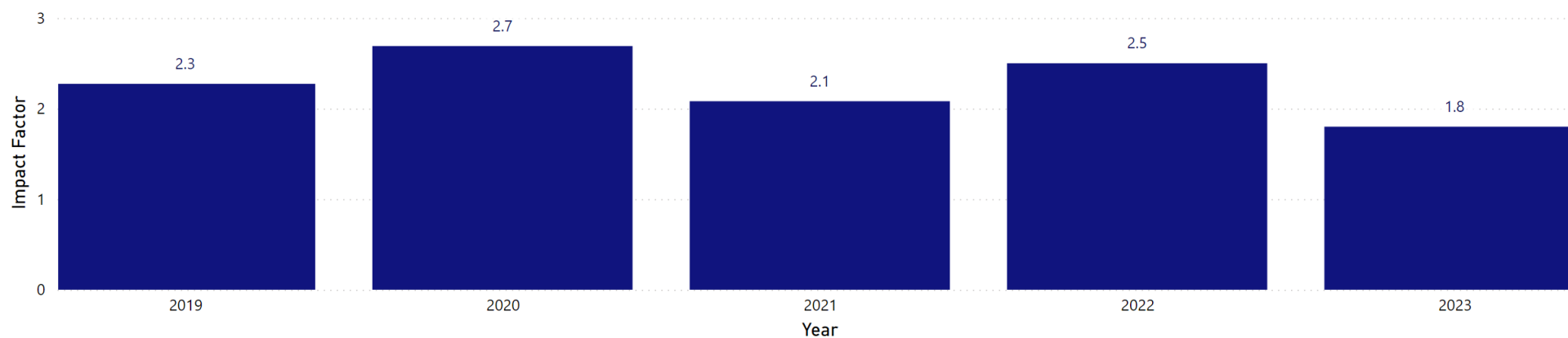

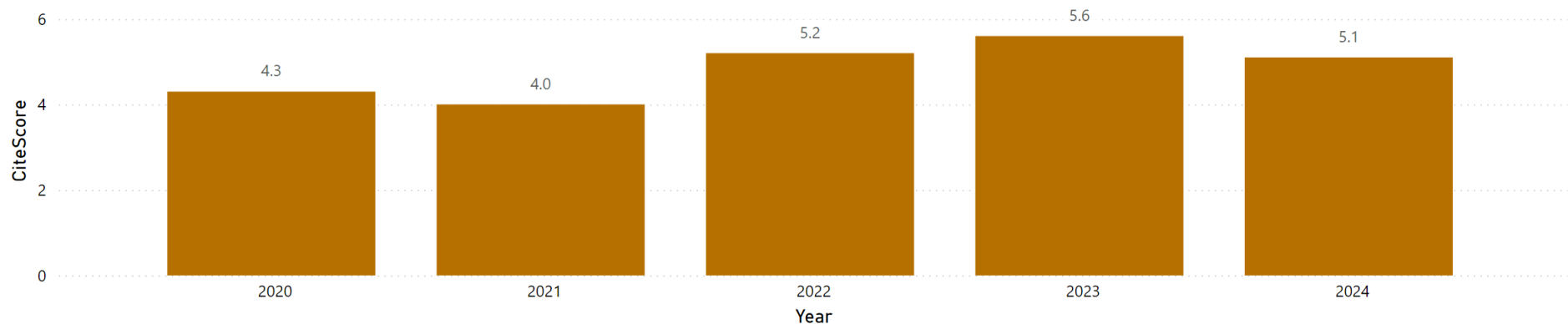

IIOA Webinar Corner




- IIOA Webinars **started in 2021** and were organized by Douglas Meade, Bart Los, and Sanjiv Mahajan.
