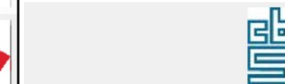

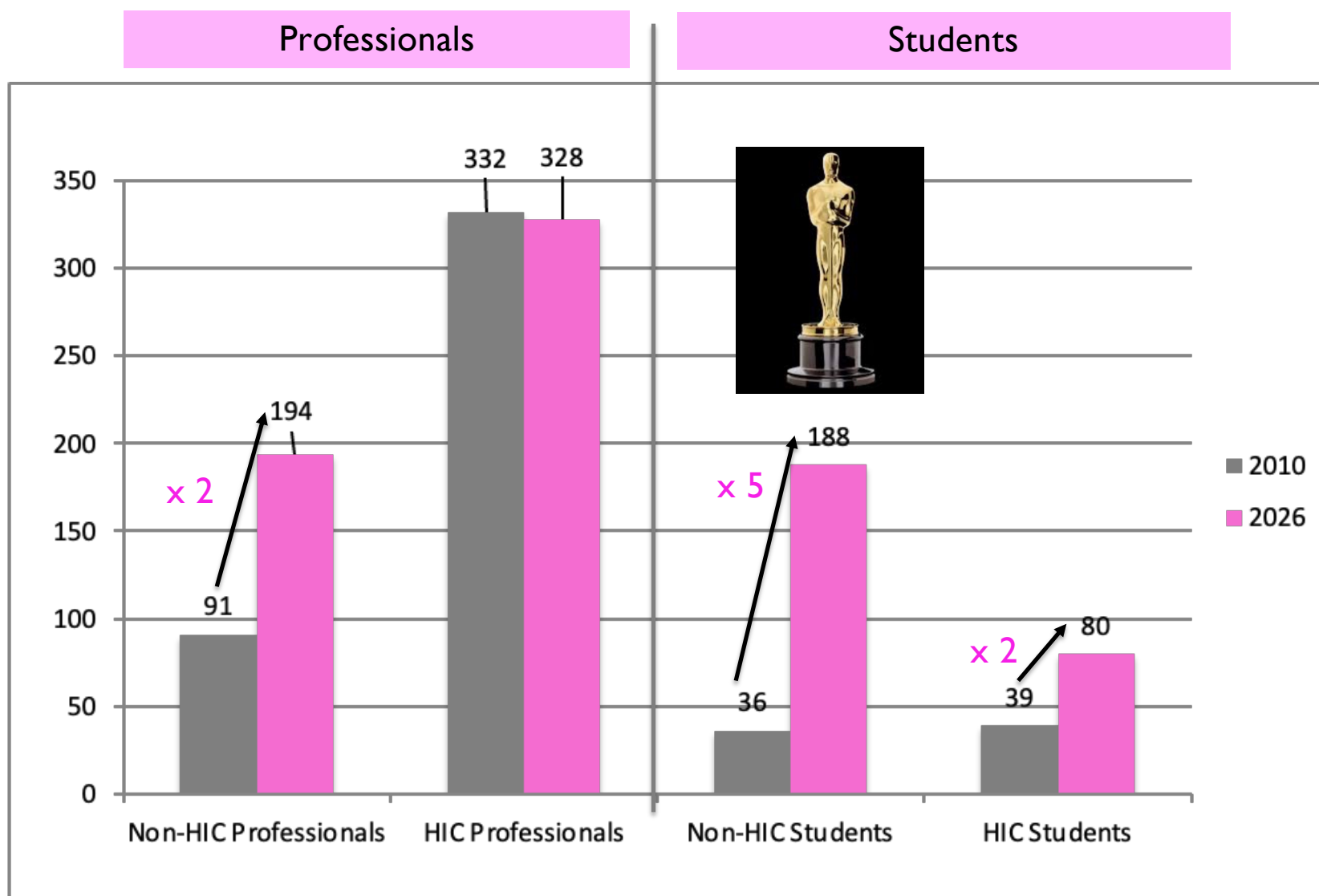

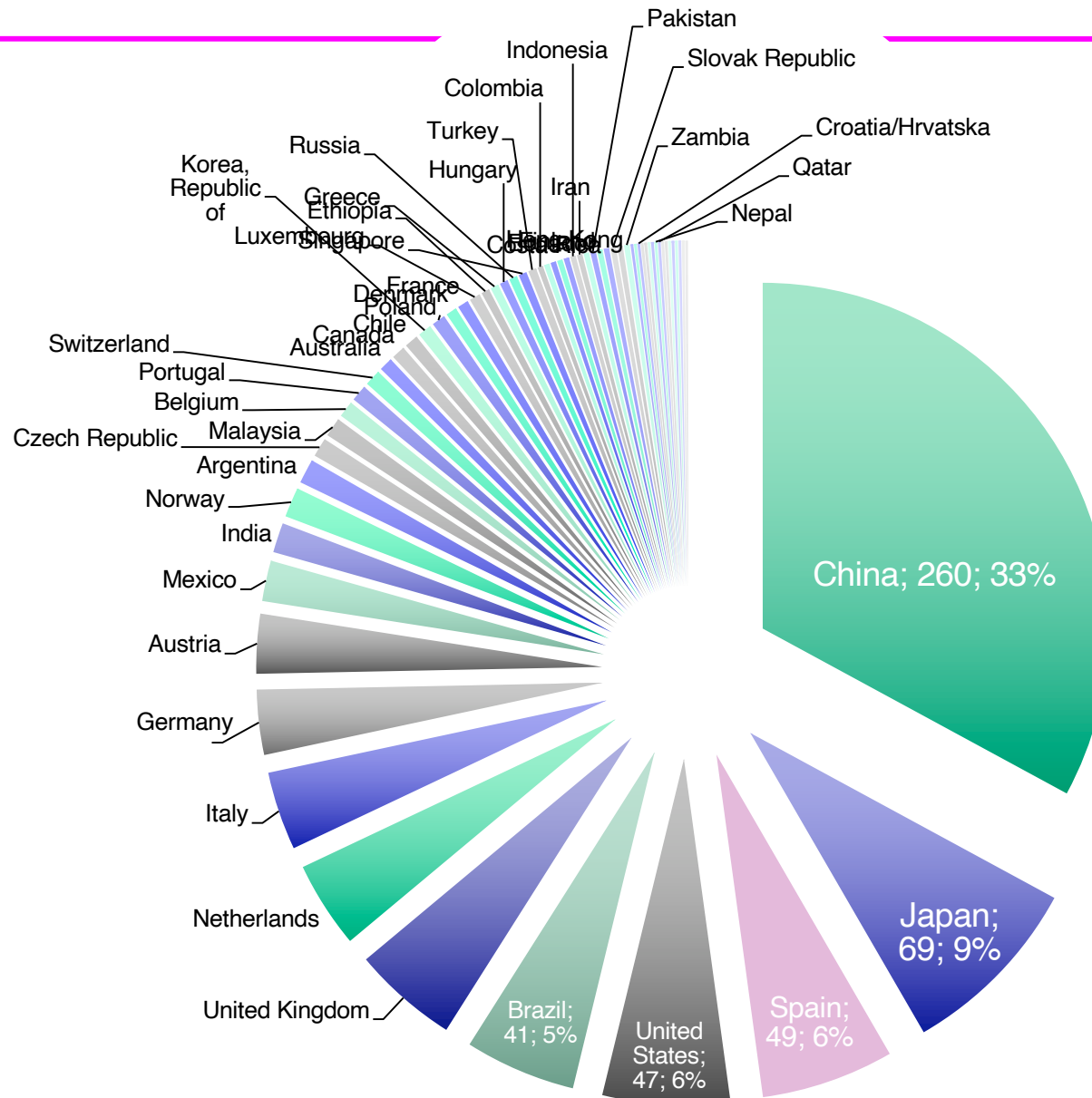


IIOA Membership 2010 and 2026

Members by Country Group and Experience

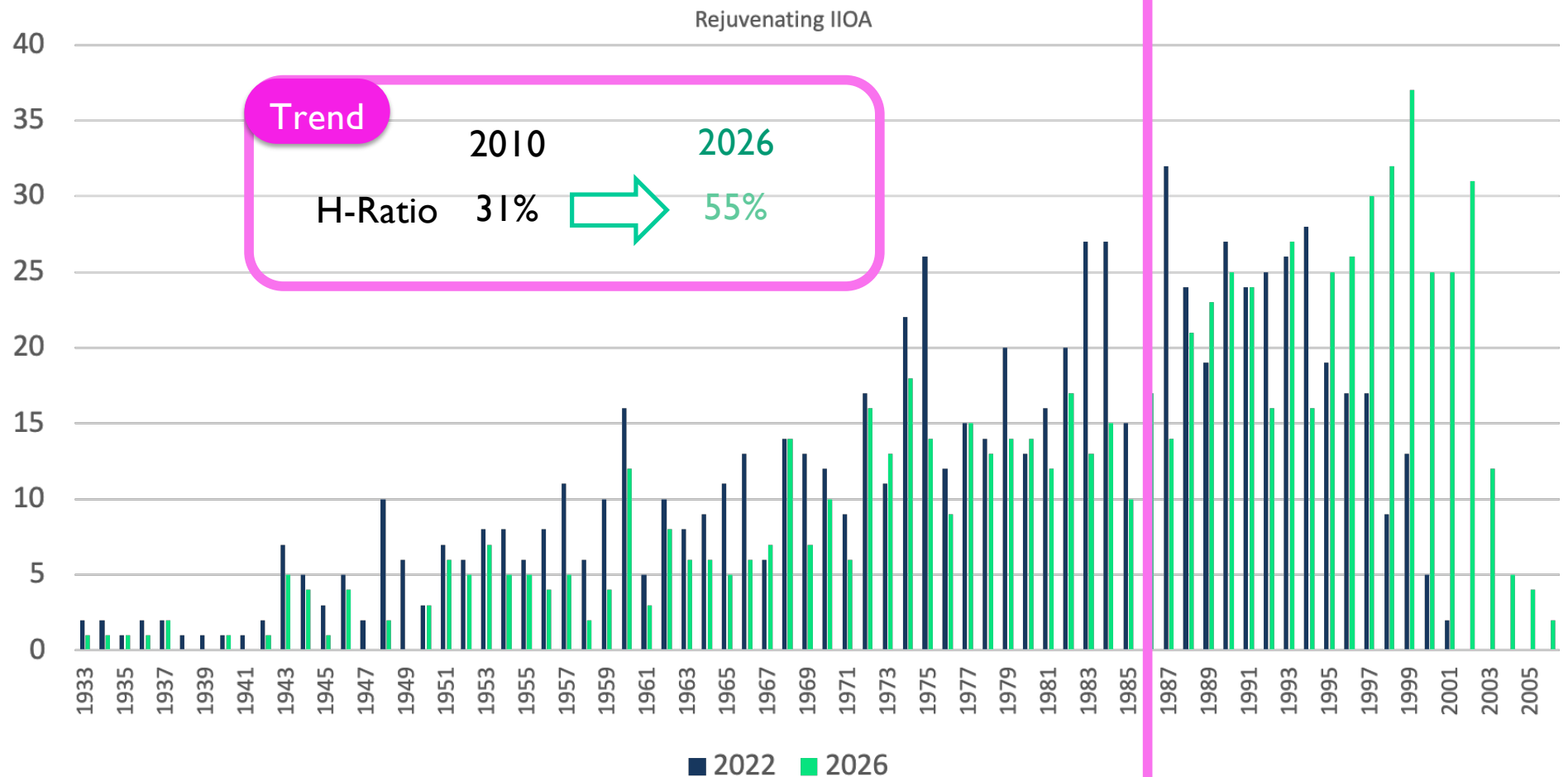


IIOA Membership as of 24 June 2026: 790 Persons, 64 Countries

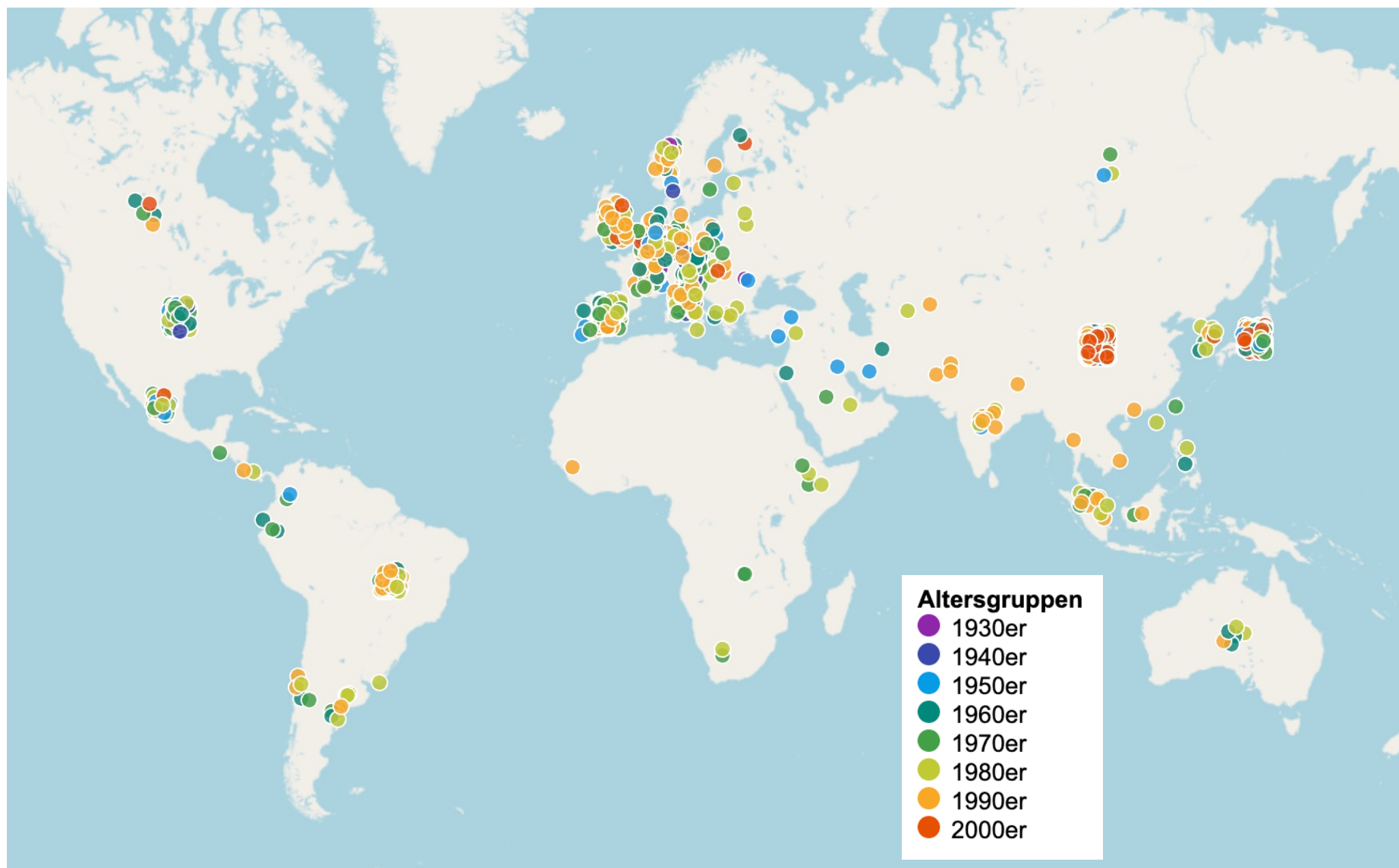


„Hewings Ratio“

Financial Report

IIOA Financials 2025

Overall Result

- **Cash Accounting** year-end results for 2025 show a **deficit of -53,000 US\$**. The drivers behind this result are the following:
 - ✓ A planned deficit of **US\$ 11,000** due to arrears from 2024
 - ✓ A payment system change by Taylor & Francis lead to arrears of **US\$ 35,000.-** for the 2025 Royalties **Advance** payment. (NOTE: the payment arrived in February 2026)
 - ✓ Software & Telecommunications costs exceeded the planned budget by **US\$ 9,000**

Revenues (other than Taylor & Francis Royalties & Editorial Support)

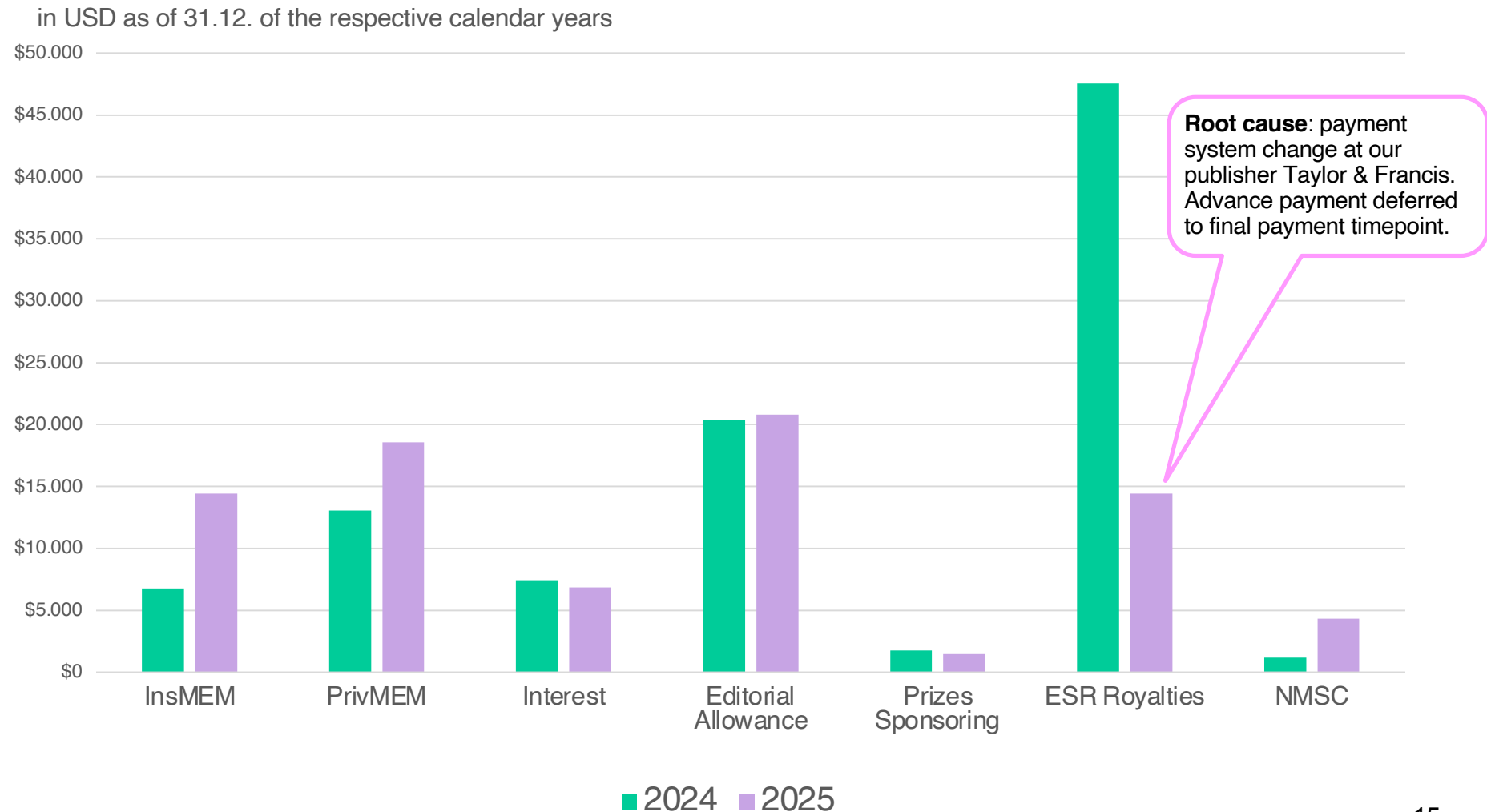
- **Institutional Membership contributions** doubled to **US\$ 14,000**.
- **Private Membership contributions** increased by 40% to **US\$ 18,500**.
- **Interest** revenues remained fairly stable at around **US\$ 7,000**. (NOTE: in February 2026 our Swimsol Eco-Project paid out US\$ 2,000)
- The **Non-Members Surcharge** of the Maldives conference was higher at **US\$ 4,300**.

Expenditures 2025

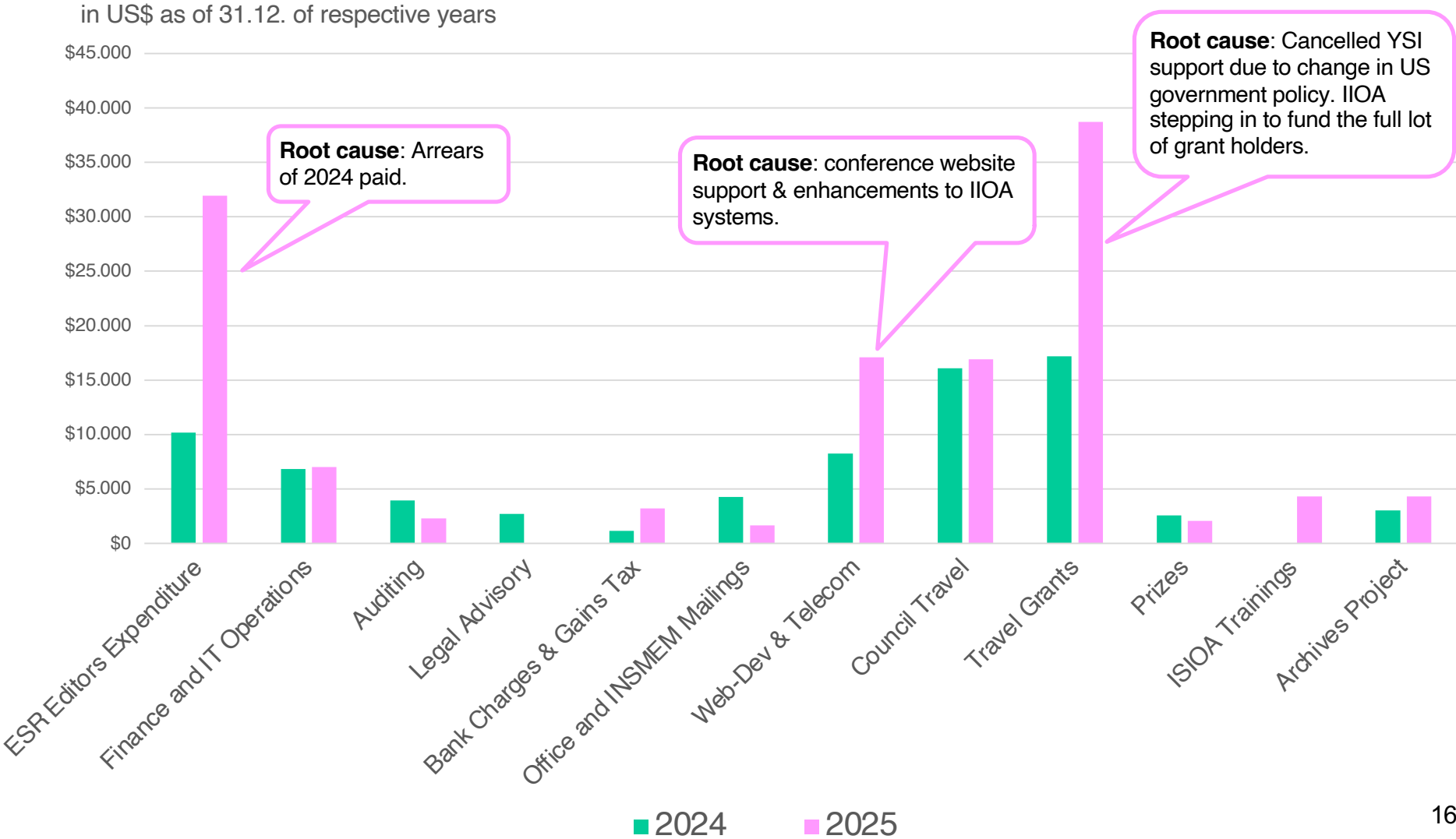
- **Travel Grants** co-sponsoring by the YSI Programme **cancelled!** Rockets to **US\$ 32.000**
- **Council Travel** constant level at **US\$ 17.000**
- **ESR Editors Allowance** paid out **US\$ 32.000.-** to cover the arrears from 2024.
- The **IIOA Archive Project** created costs of over **US\$4.300.-** , which includes legal advice, document logistics to Oviedo University, and a salary for our Indian expert for data entry and validation.
- The **ISIOA School** has become popular, with expenses of **US\$ 4,300** slightly below budget limit.
- **IT service** expenditures jumped to **US\$ 17.000** to cover major extensions of our systems.
- **No Legal Support was needed.**
- **Auditing** expenditure fell back to the typical annual **US\$ 2.300.**
- **Banking** charges and **capital gains tax** increased to **US\$ 3.200** due to interest revenue taxed.
- **All other expenditures** were constant or lower than in years before.

Asset base, solidly built up since 2006

2025 Quick Summary

1. **2025 was a good year** for IIOA, with a successful **conference** in Maldives.
2. Membership Contributions **increased**.
3. The deficit due to open arrears for *ESR Royalties* and *IT-Developments* is a historical “bomb”, but...
4. IIOA’s **asset base** amounting to **US\$328.000** (cash basis) is **solid** and can take such shocks without even blinking.
5. To increase IIOA’s **interest revenues** and contribute to **ecological transformation**, US\$21,000 have been invested in a SWIMSOL bond in 2024. SWIMSOL is a leading manufacturer of **swimming photovoltaic power plants**.



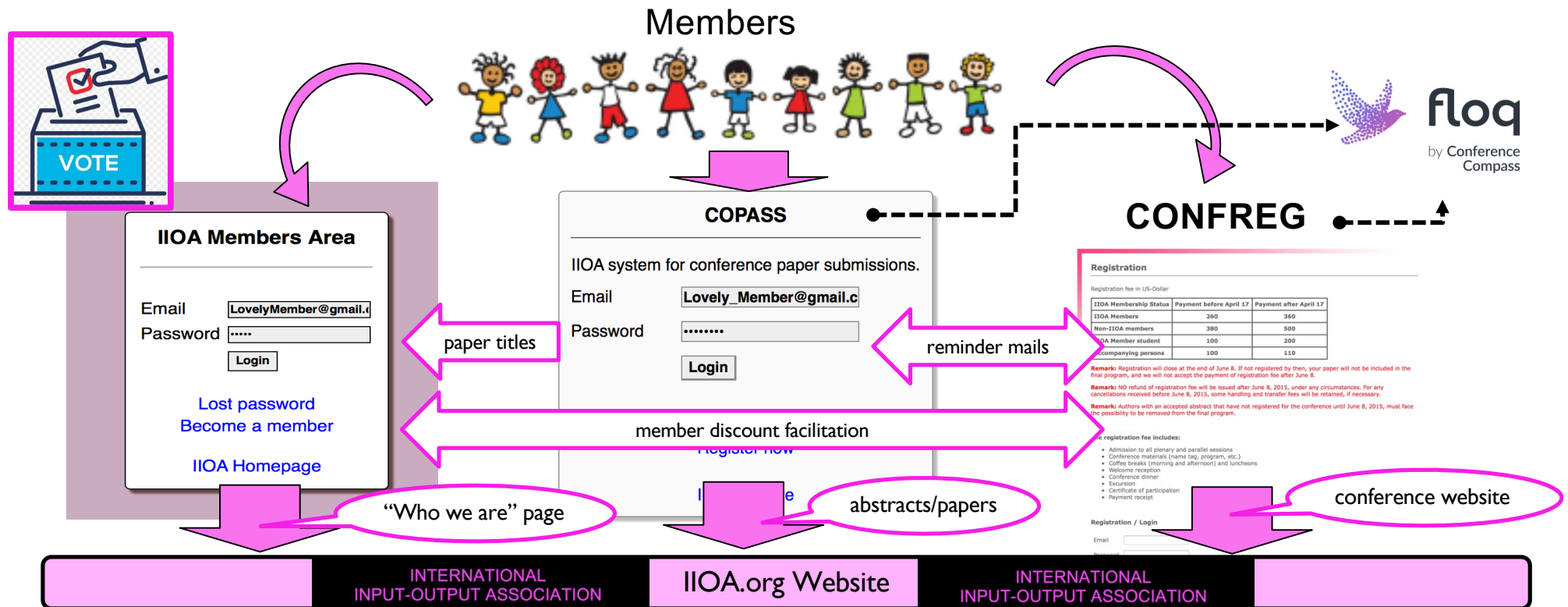
- **9% interest per annum**
- funds the energy transition of island economies.
- The project saves **1.3 million liters of diesel** and related CO2 emissions **per year**.
- Investment **returns paid** back to IIOA amounted to **US\$ 600** in 2025 and **US\$ 2,000** in 2026.
- **1 IIOA travel grant** this year is an **ECO-Grant**.

Outlook for 2026

- **Royalties** are expected to rocket to **US\$ 82,000** including arrears payments.
- **Travel grants expenditure** will remain the highest expenditure item. Estimated at **US\$ 25,000**.
- **Editorial Expenditure** and **Editorial Works sponsoring** by T&F will increase by 2% as agreed **US\$ 21,400**.
- **Interest** income estimated conservatively will be at **US\$ 7,500**.
- We conservatively estimate a **US\$ 5,000 Non-Members Surcharge** Contribution from the Seville Conference.
- **Private and Institutional Membership** contributions estimated to emerge at average level of past 7 years **US\$ 25,000**.
- **IT Costs:** expected to decrease to **US\$ 12,000**.
- **IO Archive** project will continue: provision of **US\$ 5,000** for data entry and validation, legal support, shipment of rare physical archive originals to University of Oviedo.
- **ISIOA Trainings** are conservatively estimated to trigger expenditures at ca. **US\$ 5,000** this year.
- **Administration, Office Operations Costs:** expected constant.
- Based on all these **conservative estimates** we expect a cash-accounting **Surplus** of over **US\$45,000**.

A new membership duty, and a clearer ground for exclusion.

Code of Professional Conduct

§ 5(1) · § 6(5)

WHAT CHANGES

- New duty in § 5(1): all members commit to observing the Code of Professional Conduct published by the Association.
- § 6(5) updated: a gross violation of the Code becomes an explicit ground for exclusion, replacing the older term “dishonourable conduct”.

WHY IT MATTERS

- Gives the Association a clear, written standard of conduct that all members accept.
- Replaces a vague criterion with a defined reference, making any exclusion decision more transparent and easier to apply consistently.

Code of Conduct

Who may nominate and vote

§ 11(2) · (7) · (9)

WHAT CHANGES

- Only those who became members on or before June 30 of the election year may nominate candidates and vote.
- The same cut-off date is applied consistently across § 11(2), § 11(7) and § 11(9).

WHY IT MATTERS

- Sets a single, clear eligibility date for each election.
- Prevents last-minute sign-ups from affecting an election already under way.

GROUP 2 OF 3 · STANDING FOR COUNCIL

Who may stand for Council

§ 11(2)

WHAT CHANGES

- The right to stand for Council is limited to members who have belonged to the Association for at least two years.
- The two years need not be consecutive.
- The Council electorate is now tied directly to the new voting-rights rule, replacing the broader reference to participation in the General Assembly.

WHY IT MATTERS

- Ensures Council candidates have a track record of engagement with the Association.
- The non-consecutive rule is fair to members whose membership had a gap.

The nine members to be elected shall be elected from among the members of the Association, by those members and representatives who are entitled to vote under this paragraph.

§ 11(9)

Each person entitled to vote, **namely each member or representative who has acquired membership on or before June 30 of the respective election year,** may, within two weeks, elect up to three candidates; the three candidates winning most of the votes shall be elected. In the event of a tie between two or more persons elected, lots shall be drawn. The election results shall be made available to the Auditors and shall be checked by them.

In the event of a tie between two or more persons elected, lots shall be drawn. The election results shall be made available to the Auditors and shall be checked by them.

Role of the President-elect

§ 11(11) — new

WHAT THE NEW RULE SAYS

- From election until the term begins, the President-elect is invited to participate in Council meetings.
- The President-elect has no voting rights during this period — unless he or she is already a member of Council.

WHY IT MATTERS

- Lets the incoming President observe and prepare before formally taking office.
- Avoids giving voting power to someone not yet in office and not otherwise on Council.

§ 11(11)

The Council shall elect a President to a three year term from among those members of the IIOA who are currently serving or have served as elected members on Council within the past 10 years. This election shall take place two weeks after the mid-year Council meeting preceding the commencement of the President's term of office. If the elected President is not a current member of Council, he or she will be appointed to Council for the term of his or her service. From the election until the commencement of his or her term of office, the President-elect shall be invited to participate in Council meetings, but shall have no voting rights unless he or she is already a member of Council. The President may be re-elected only once. The President's term of office shall commence on January 1 in the year after the President was elected.

ORIGINAL TEXT

The Council shall elect a President to a three year term from among those members of the IIOA who are currently serving or have served as elected members on Council within the past 10 years. This election shall be conducted as soon as possible after the election of Council members. If the elected President is not a current member of Council, he or she will be appointed to Council for the term of his or her service. The President may be re-elected only once. The President's term of office shall commence on January 1.

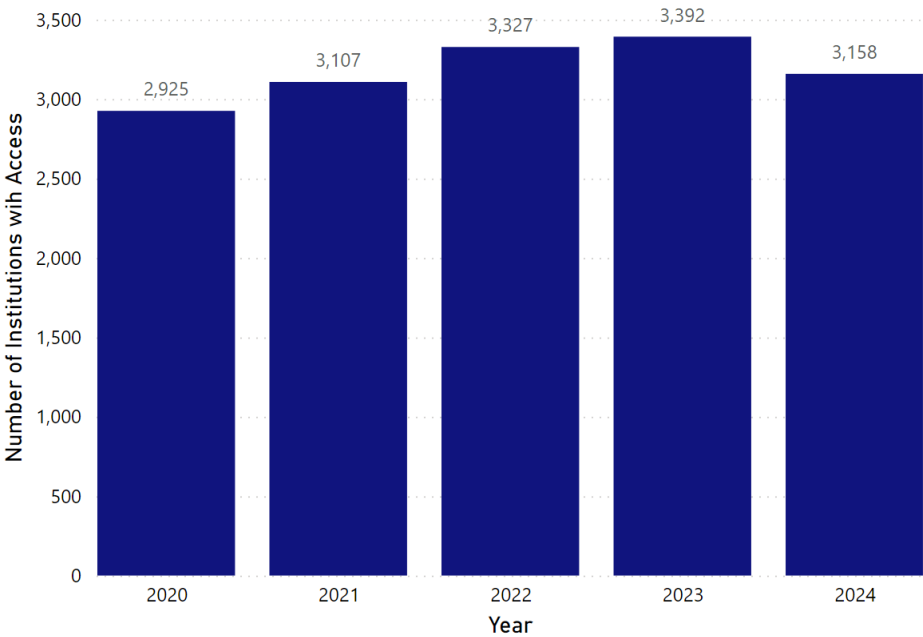

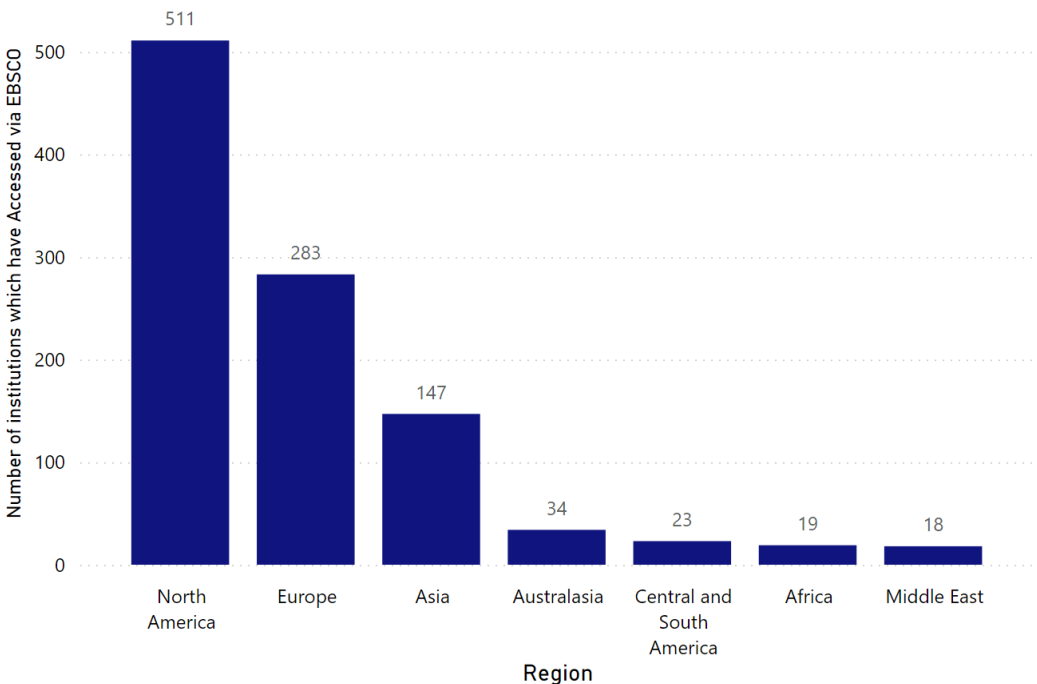

EBSCO Coverage 2025 by Region

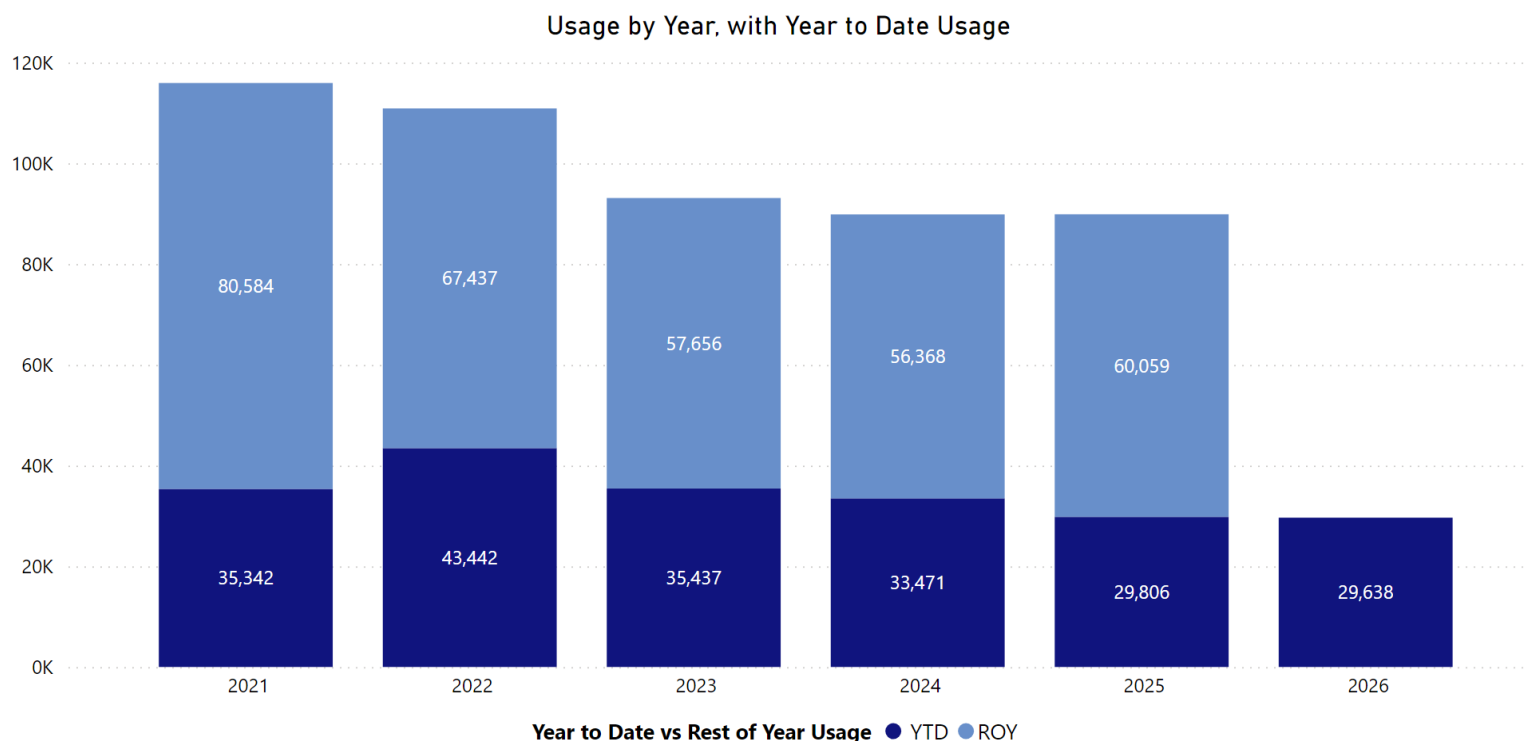

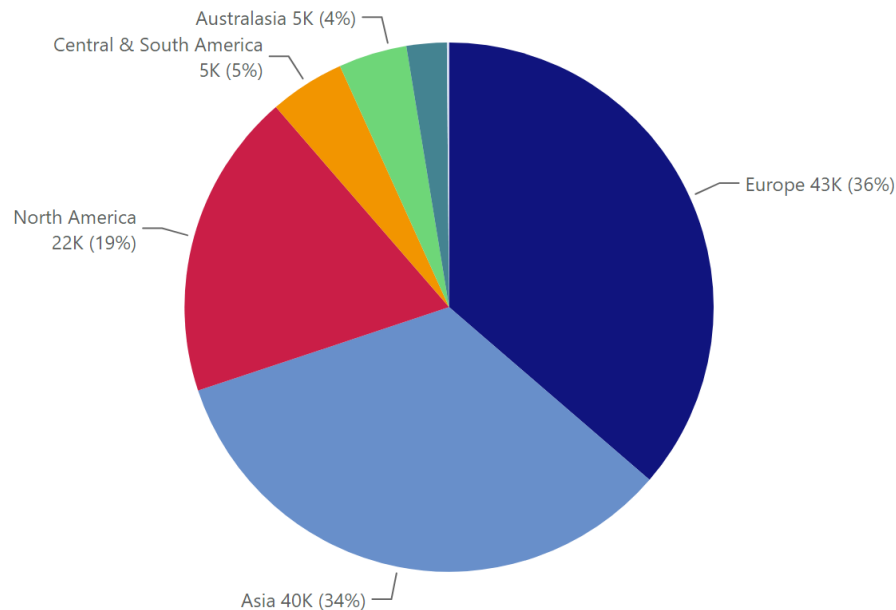

Article Downloads - Usage by Country & Region

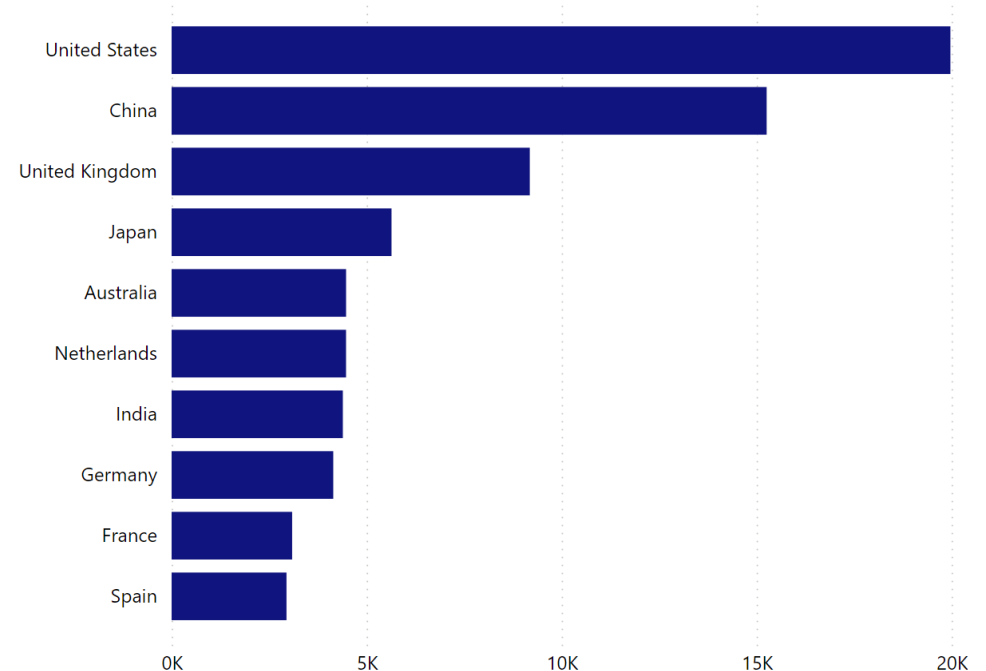

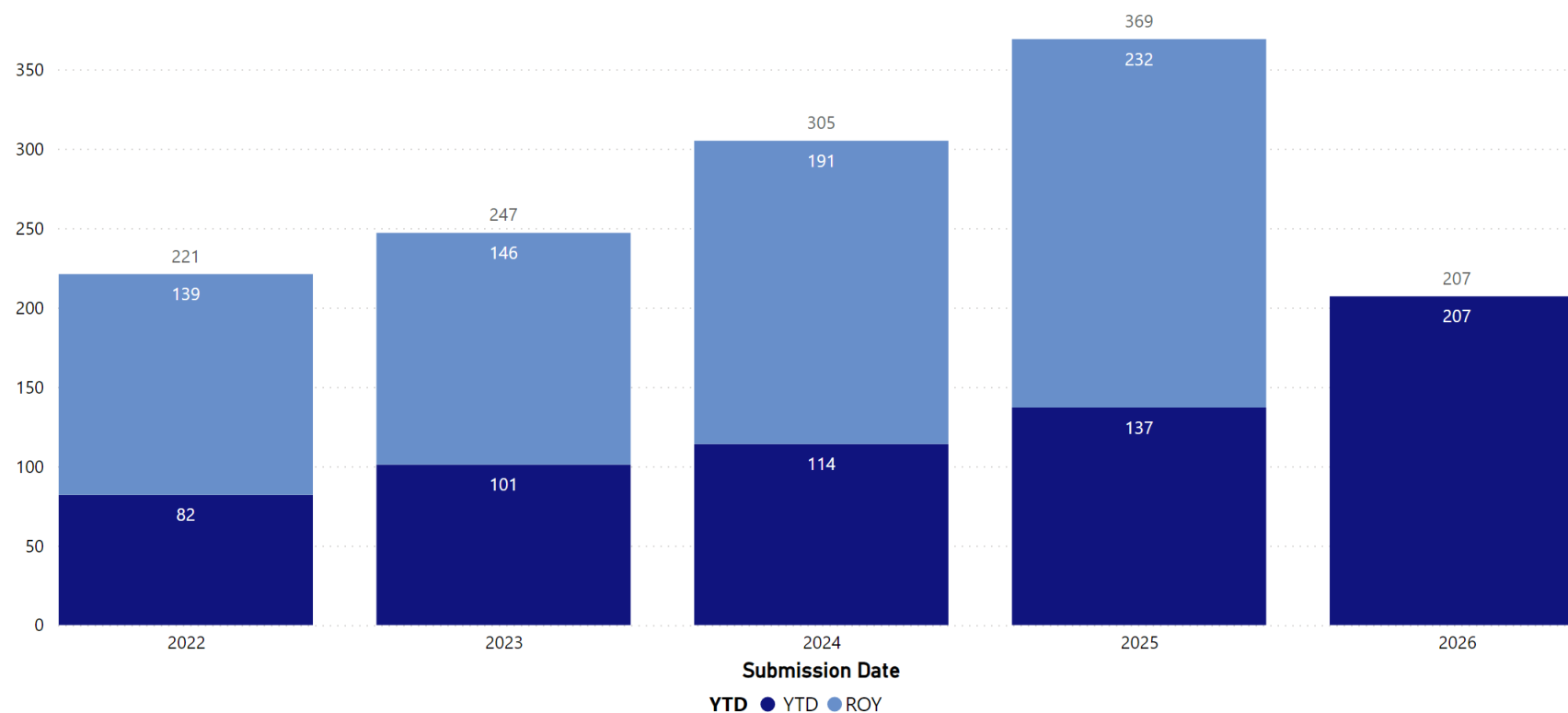

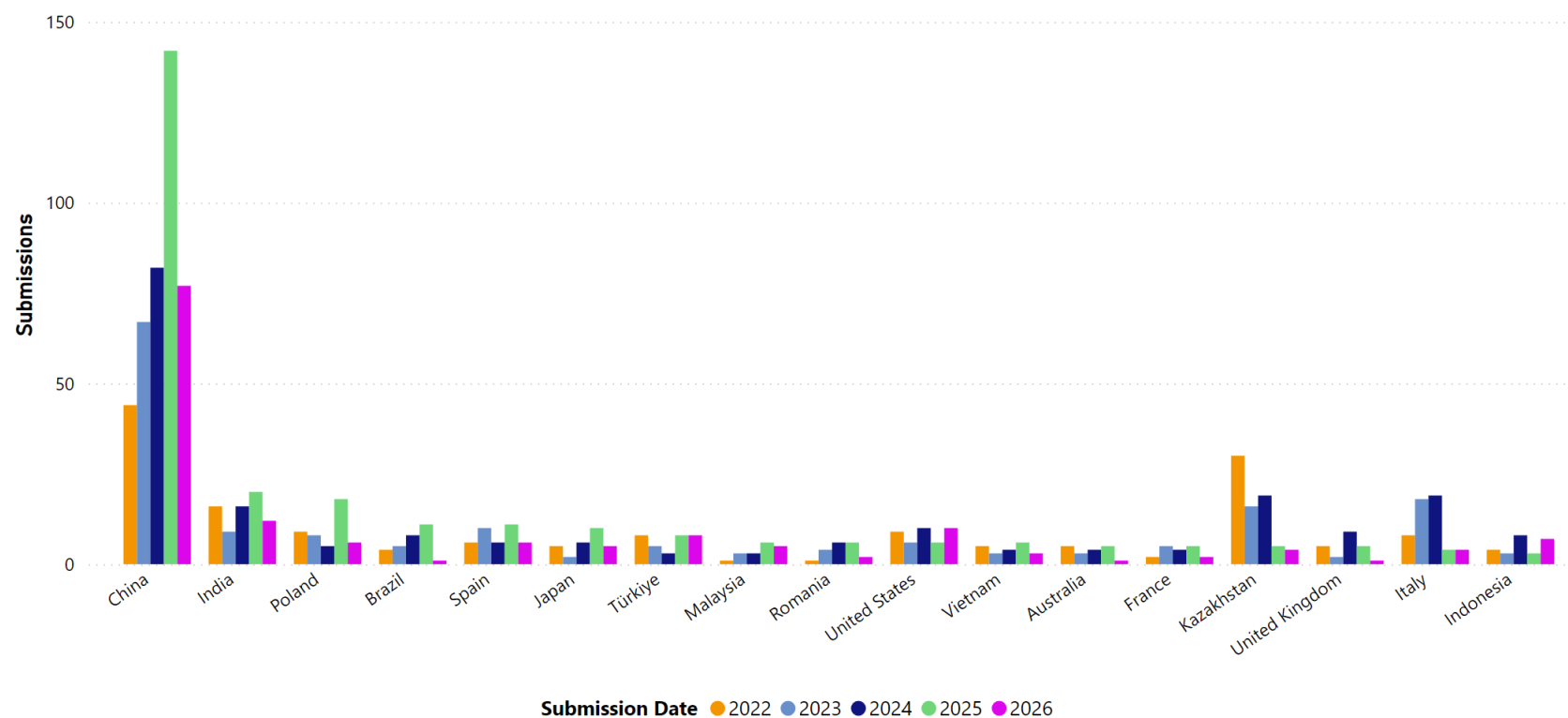

Average Speed of Article Publication*



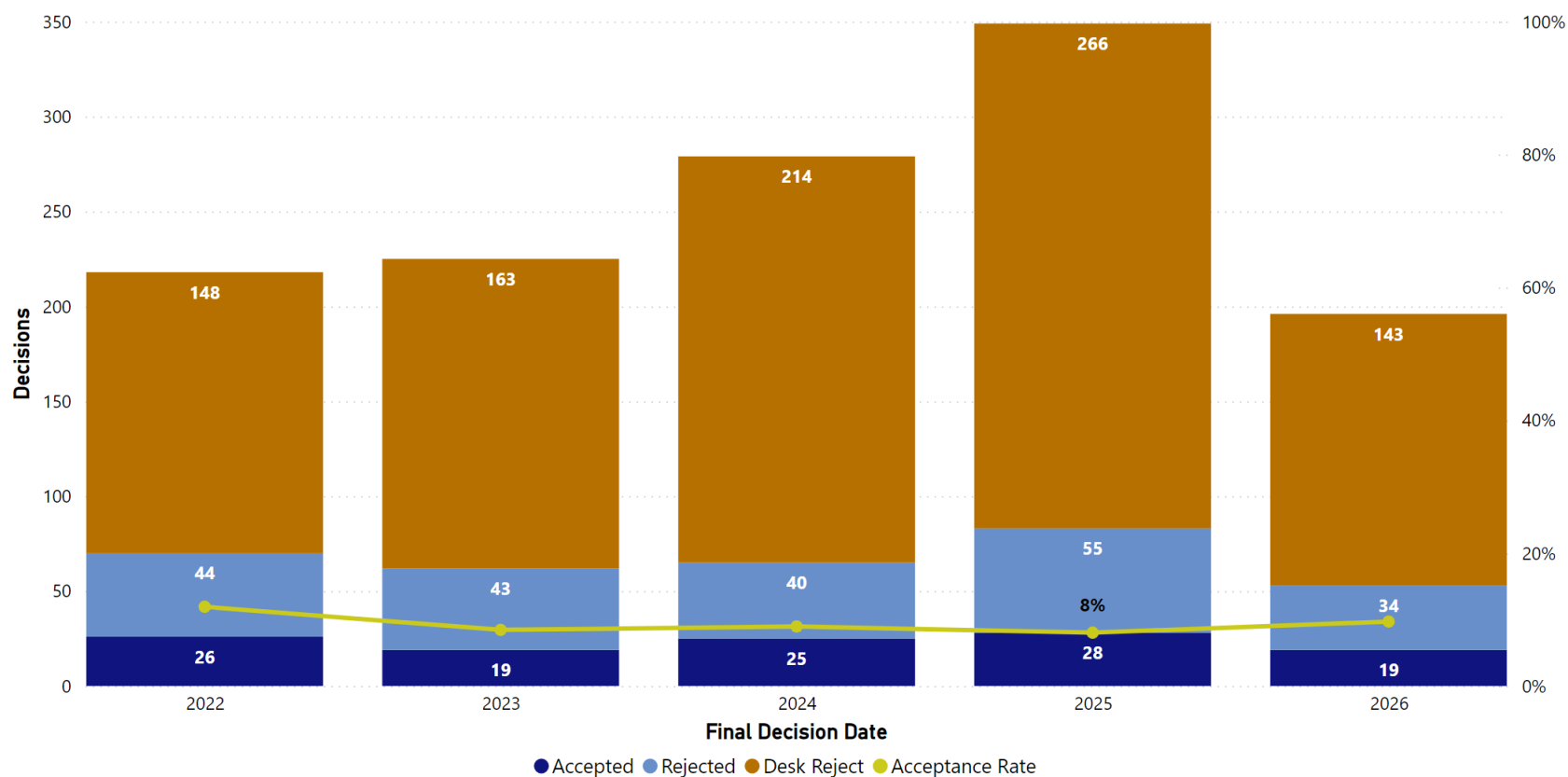

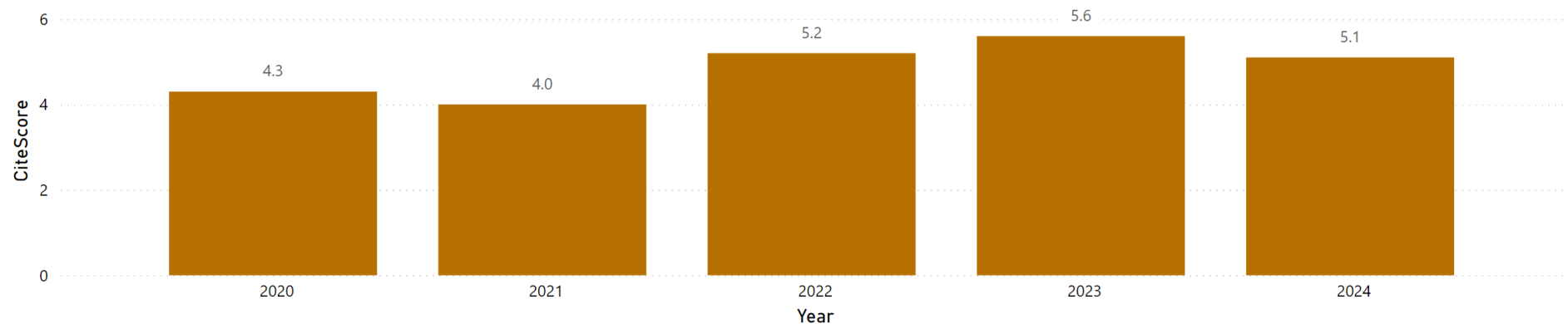
